ON August 20, 1953 Coach Rickelman issued his annual call for football players. We had lost most of our team through graduation but the new boys worked hard and soon shaped up into a fine team.

September 11

We opened the football season with the W. R. L. preview at Chardon. The team looked fine in the short scrimmage as they battled Chardon 0-0.

September 18

November 13





"Mitz", being away for a year, was only able to get one year's action on the Blue Streaks varsity. Don's keen defensive eye was a definite asset to the Streaks.




