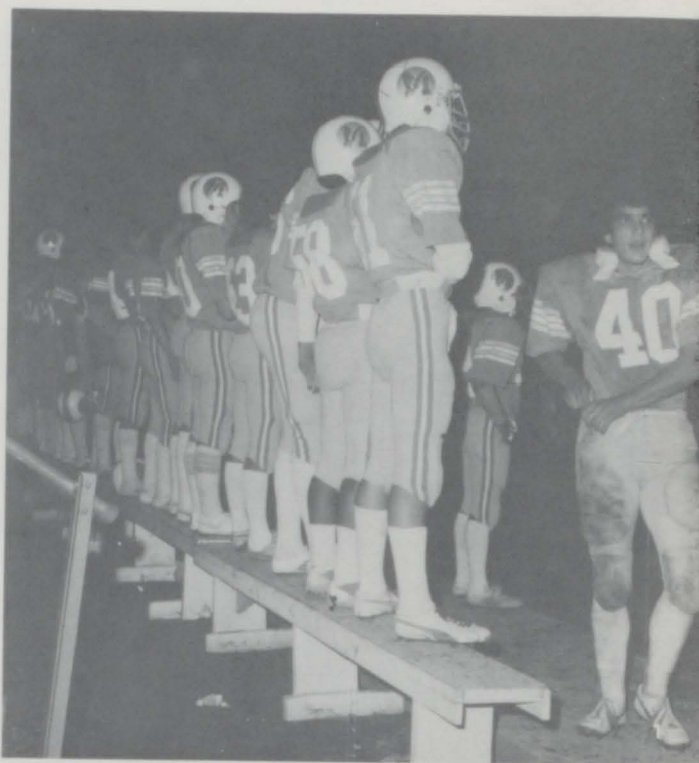
Varsity football has a losing year

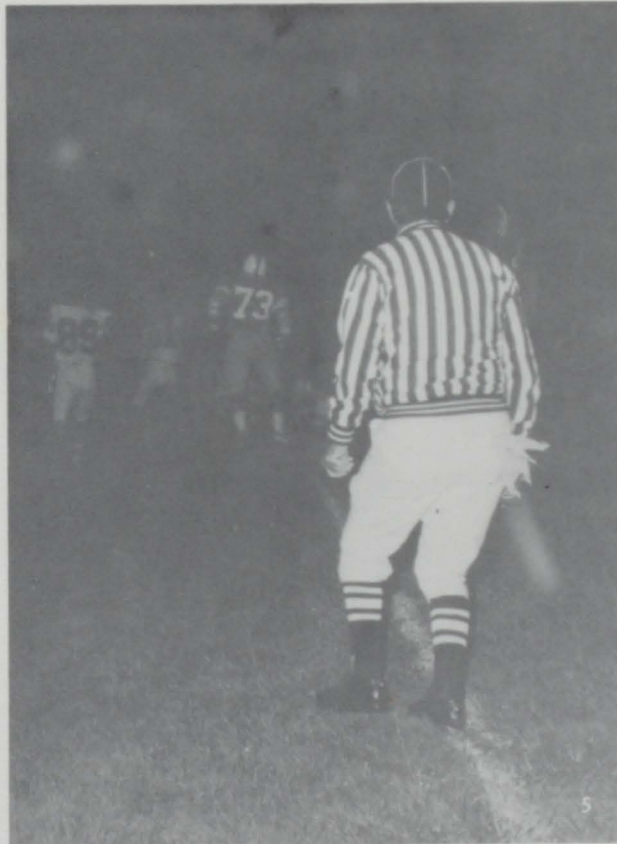
Football at Madison is under a new coach, Mr. Deering. He has worked with the squad for the past several years and took over this year when Mr. Kovats resigned the position.

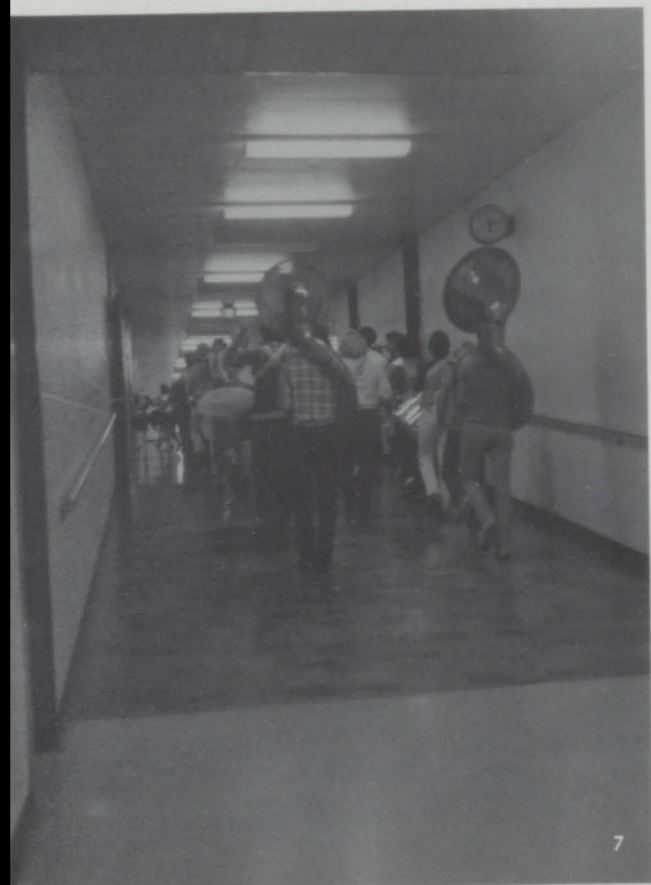
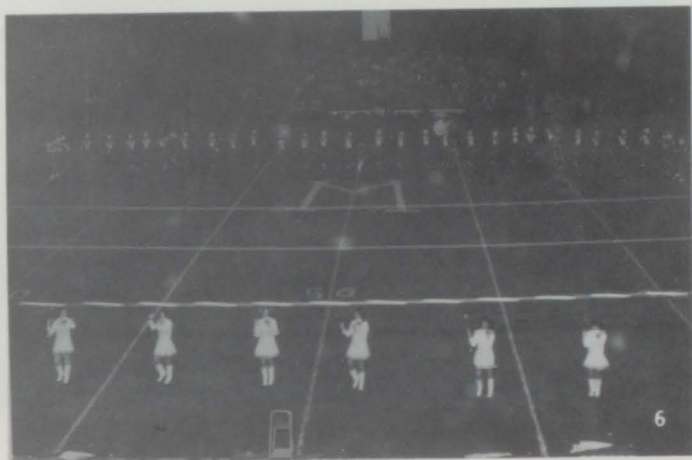


Band members hang tough in '81

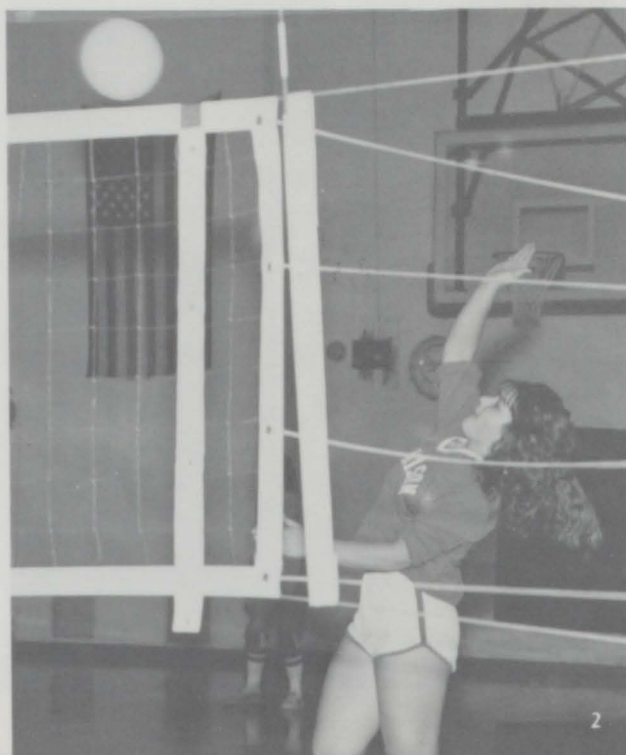

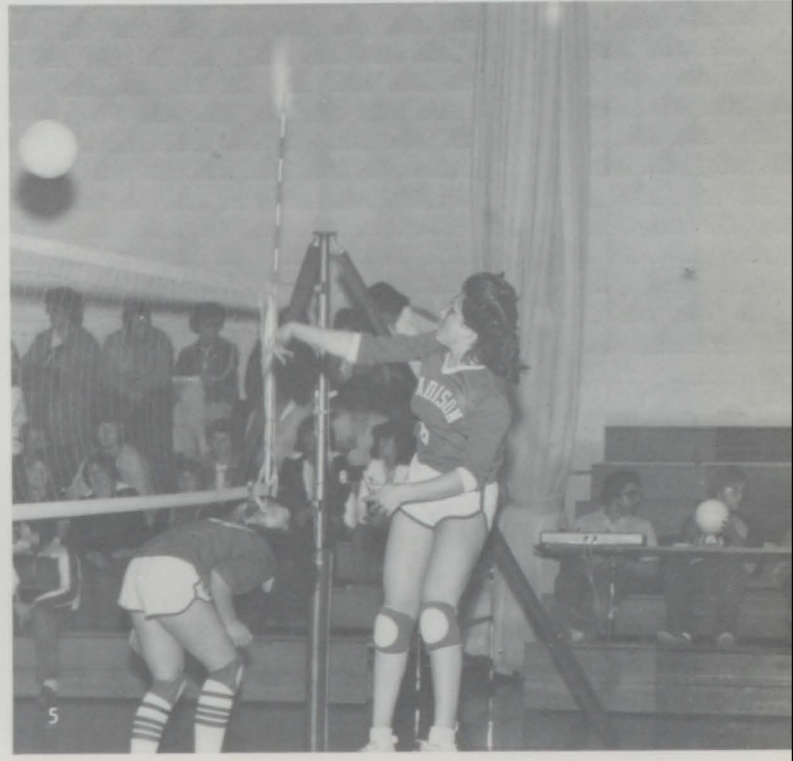


Varsity Volleyball shows improvement

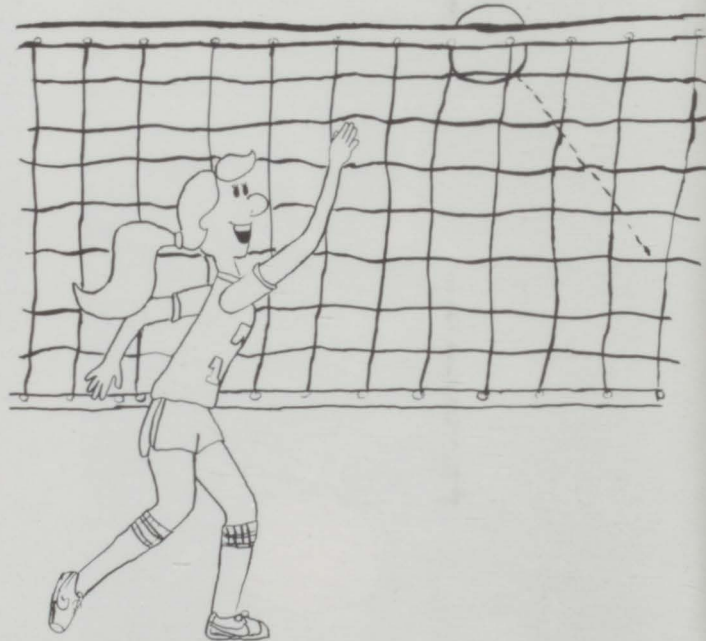

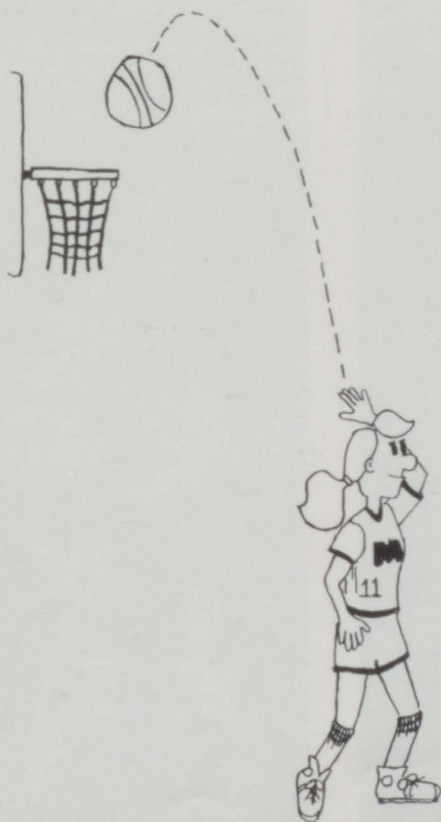
Varsity girls basketball make it big!!

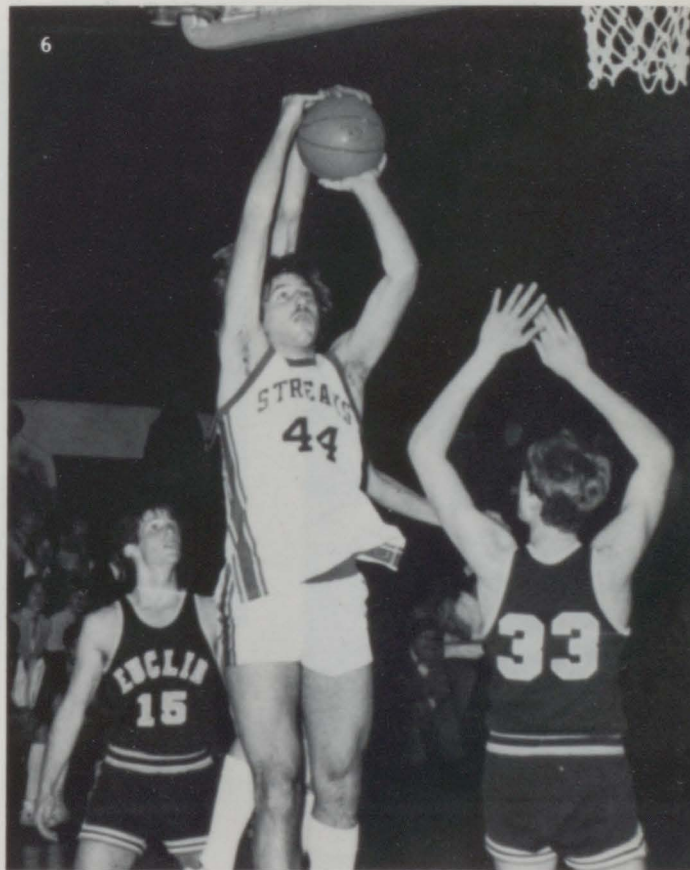

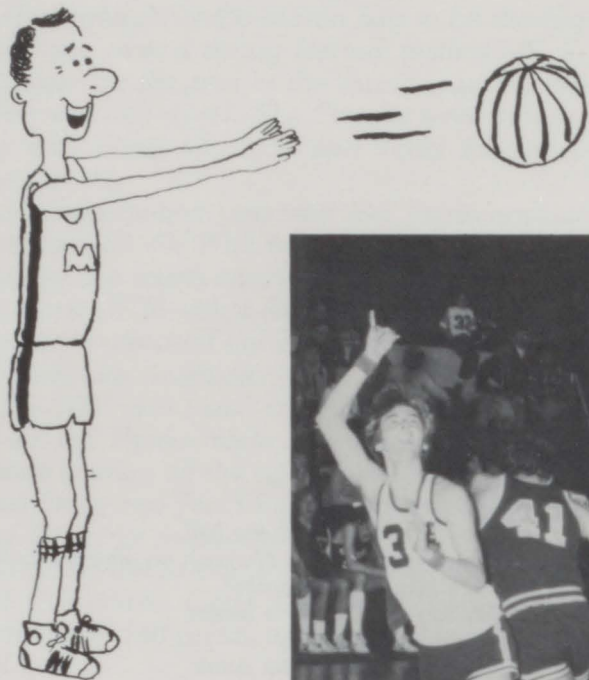

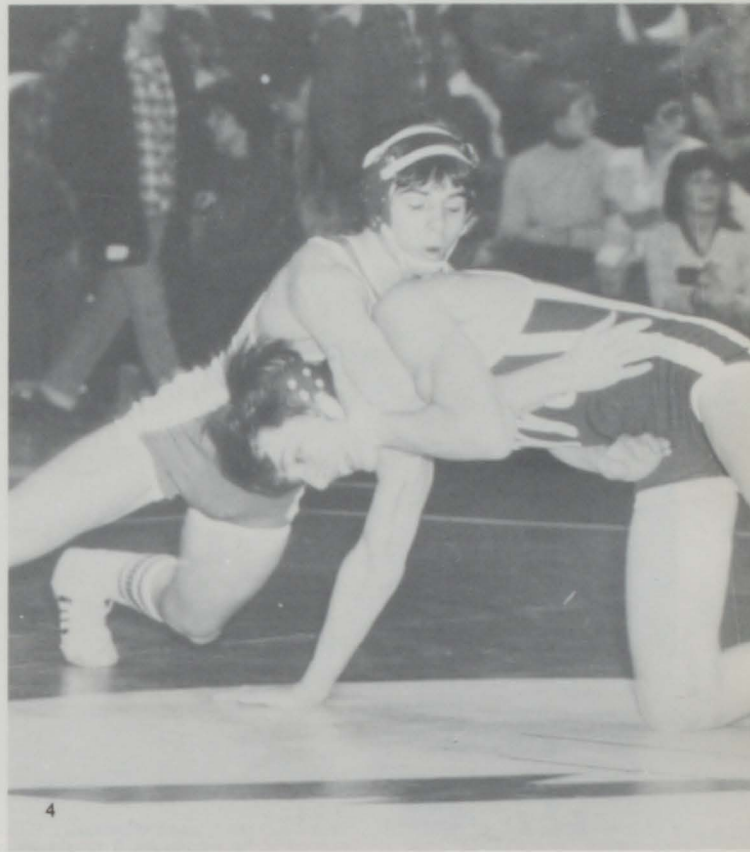
The 1989-90 wrestling season started off on the wrong foot and lost to Euclid (20-41) and Chardon (17-46).

They planted both feet on the ground and won the next 8 out of 11, ending the season with an 8-5 record.

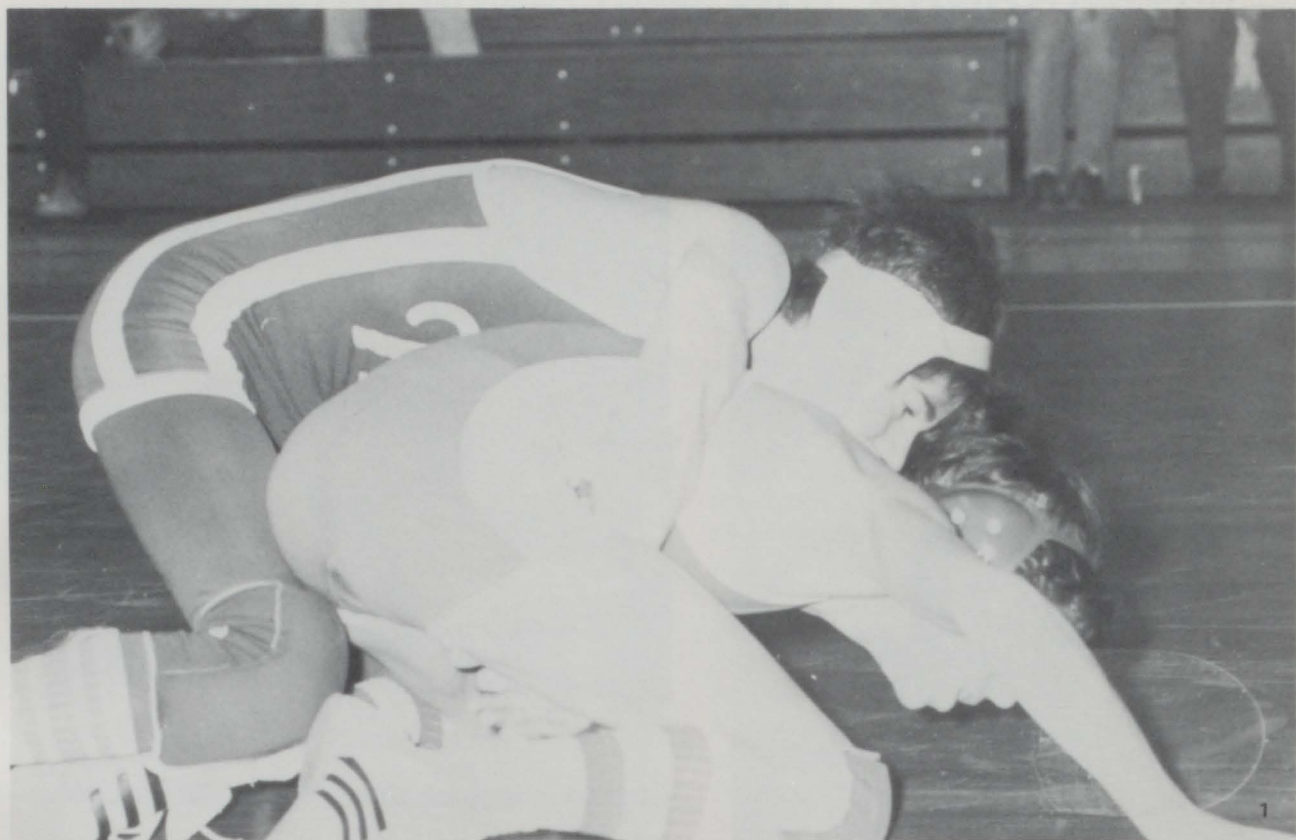

After the daily required hours at Auburn students return to the High School for other work. That time will be used for a class in History and any other required work.

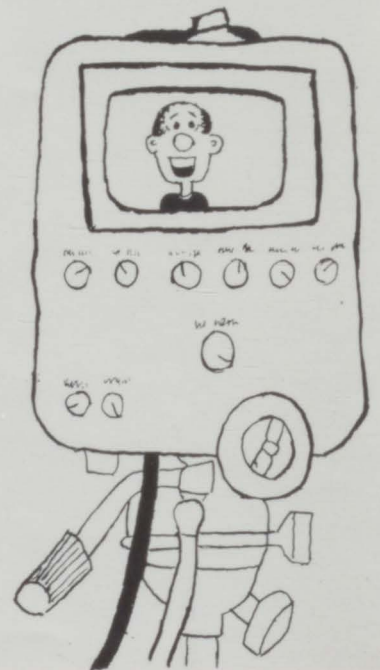


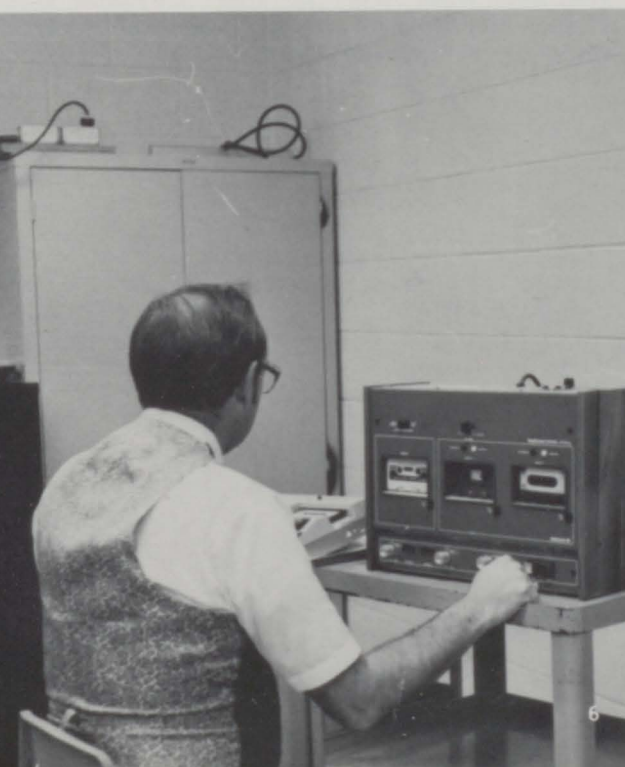
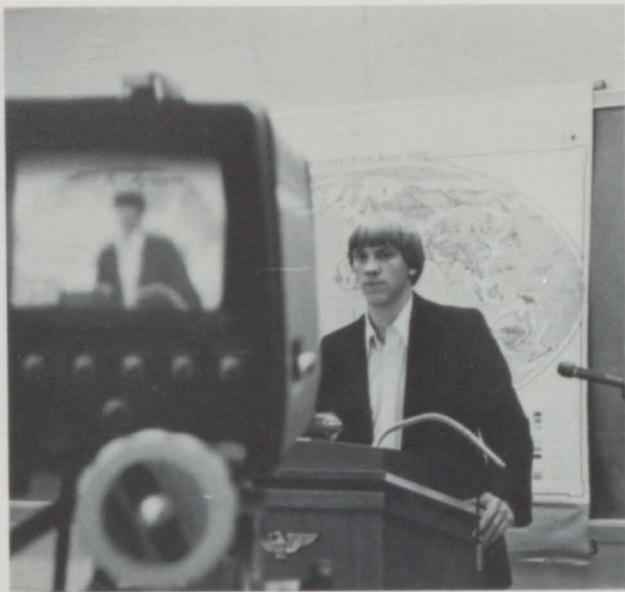

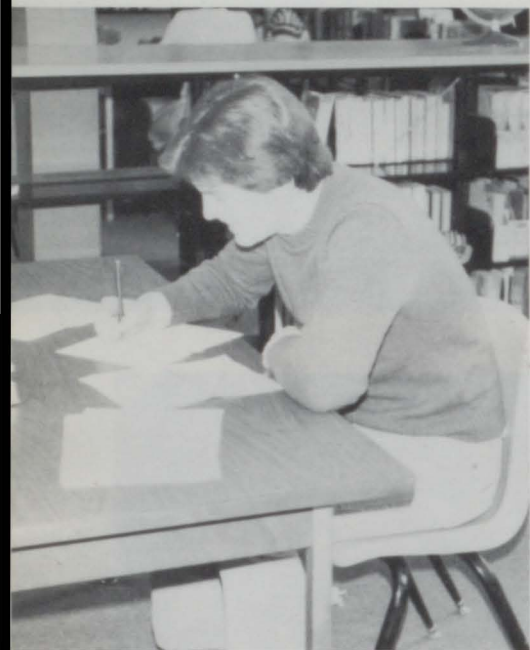
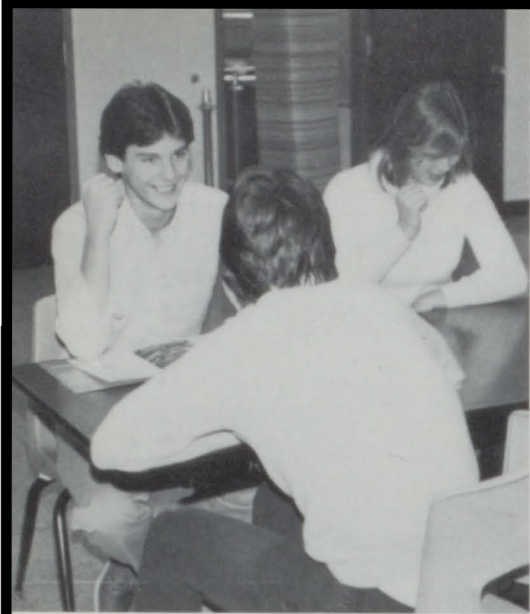
The girls 1st, place track team set records and had a lot of top placements in the N.E.C..

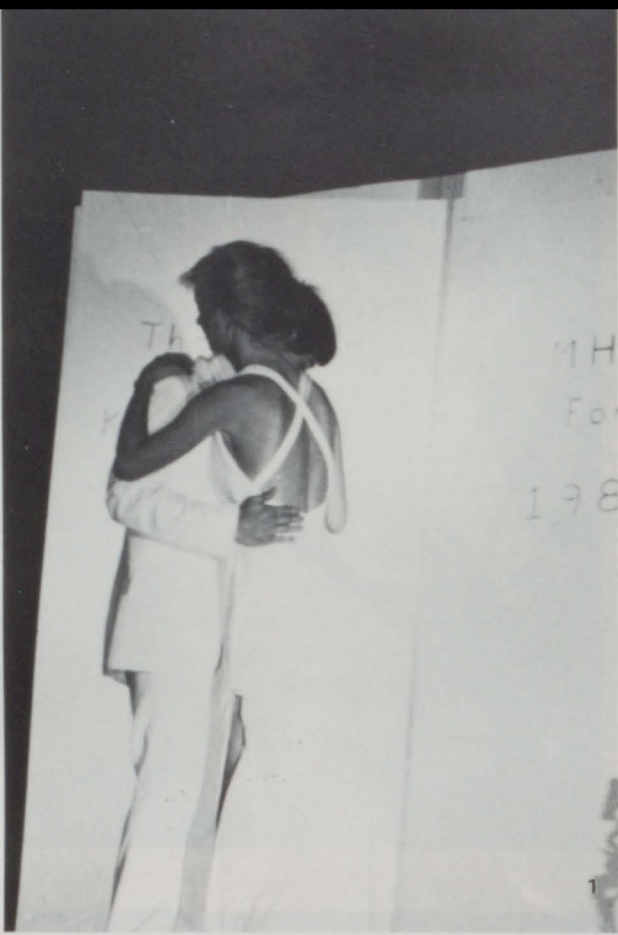
