


### Beyond the Events



# The juniors focused their sights beyond high school






# Boys, Play Nice ...






















### Splashing Toward New Goals




### Lady Tracksters Strive Standing In












### Serving Up a Successful, Unforgettable Season








## Varsity Softball Swings a Step Beyond






### What's Beyond the Fence and on the Field?







"We were really able to get out into the community this year, helping increase our goal of service to beyond just MHS," said Steve Hertrick, adviser.























# A Night Spent Beyond the Gates of a Secret Garden
