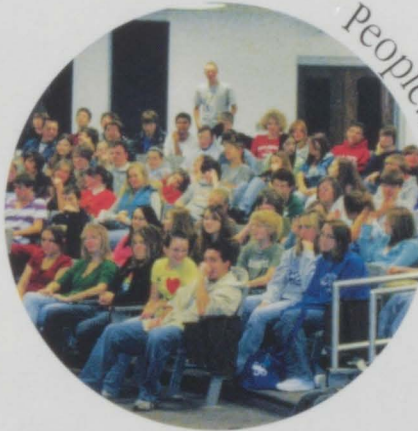

Lining up before the game, these spirit fans see how many people they have to make the saying for this week's game.

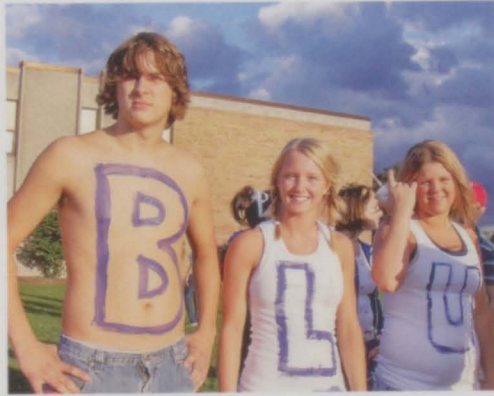

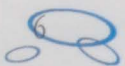

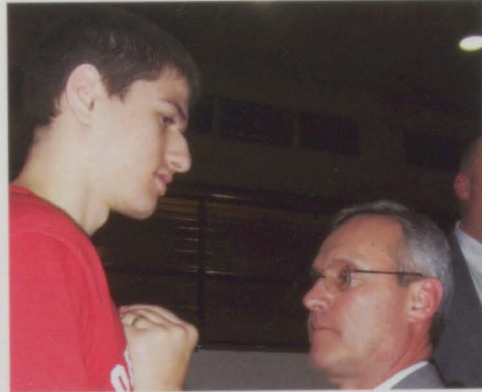

While awaiting the arrival of The Ohio State Coach, these freshmen take a break from their studies and show that they have true Ohio State spirit.

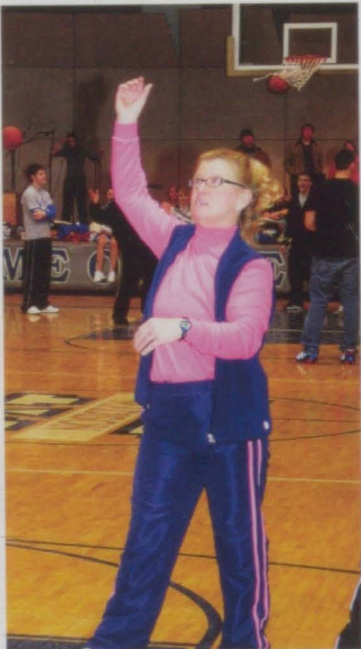

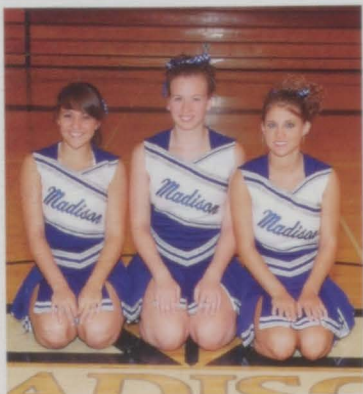

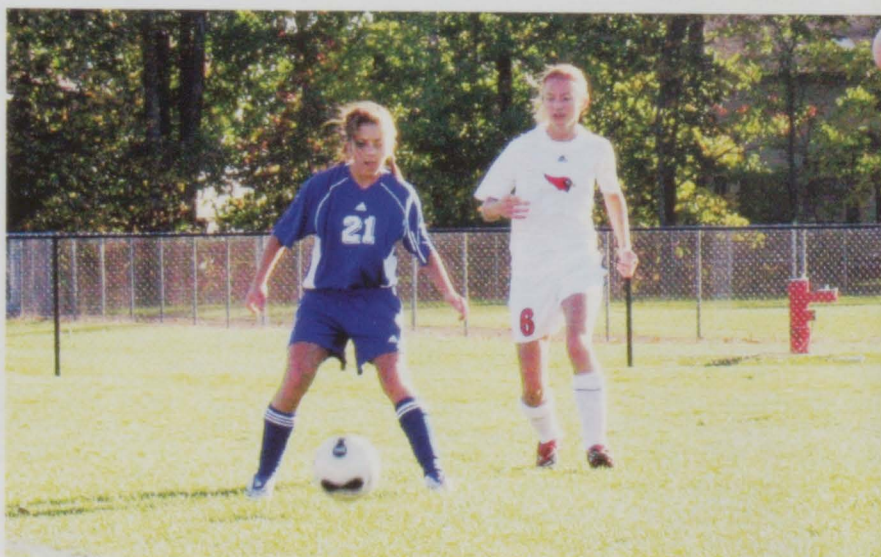

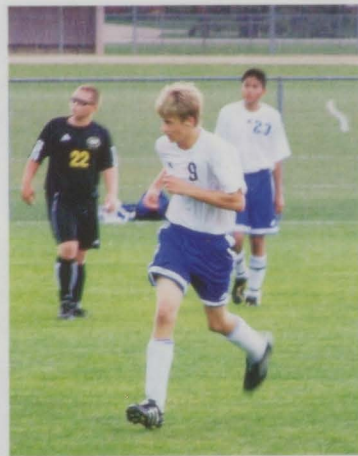

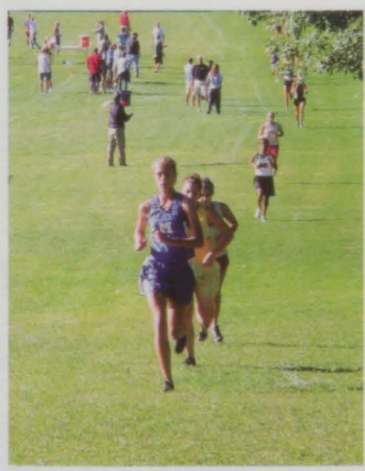

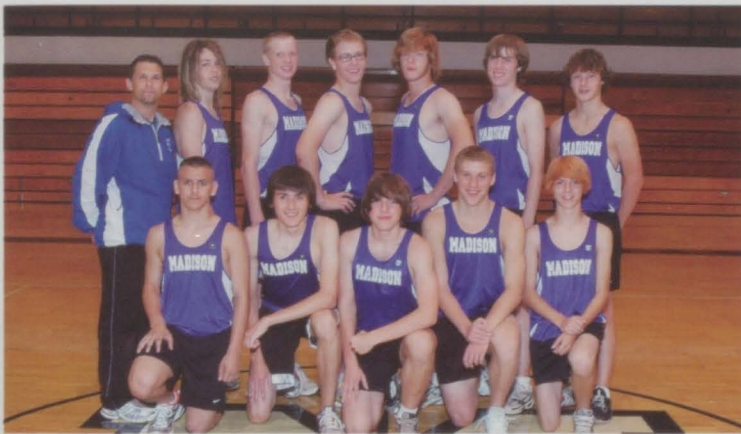

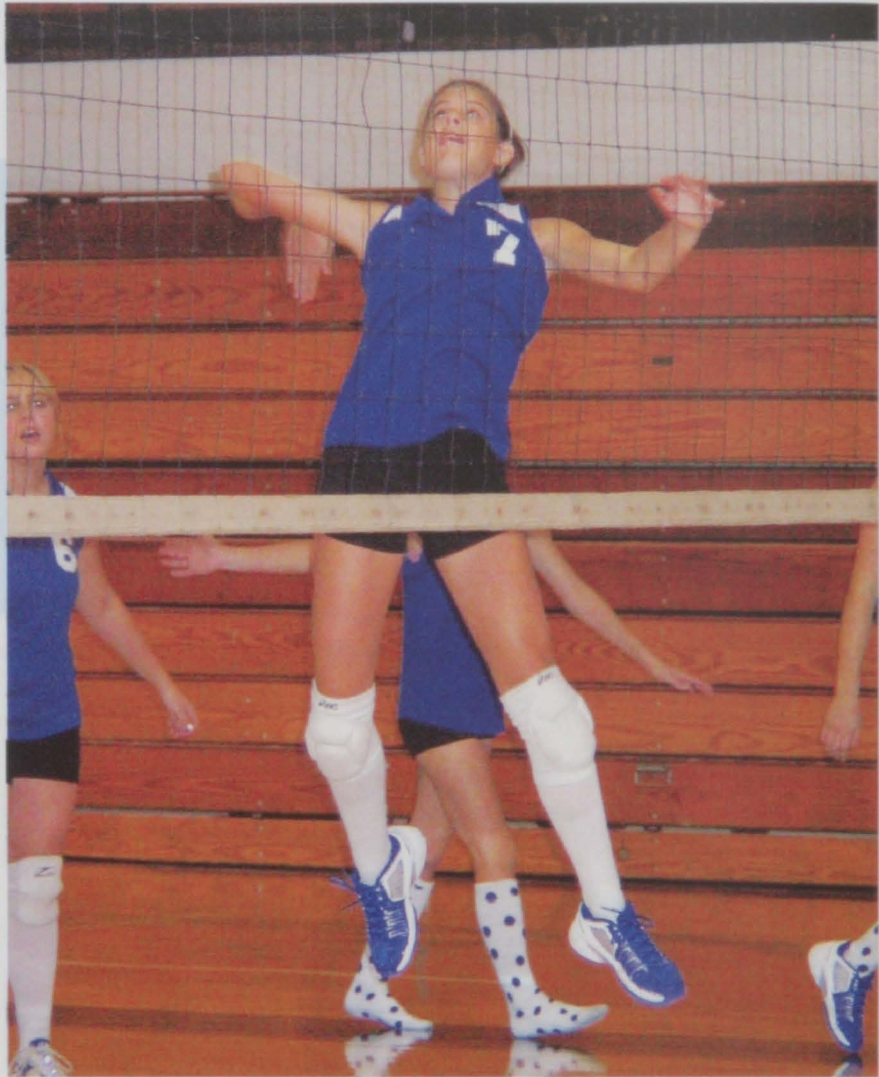

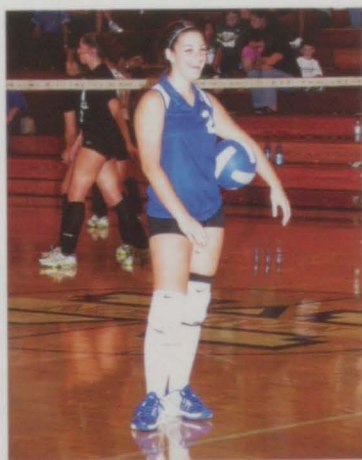

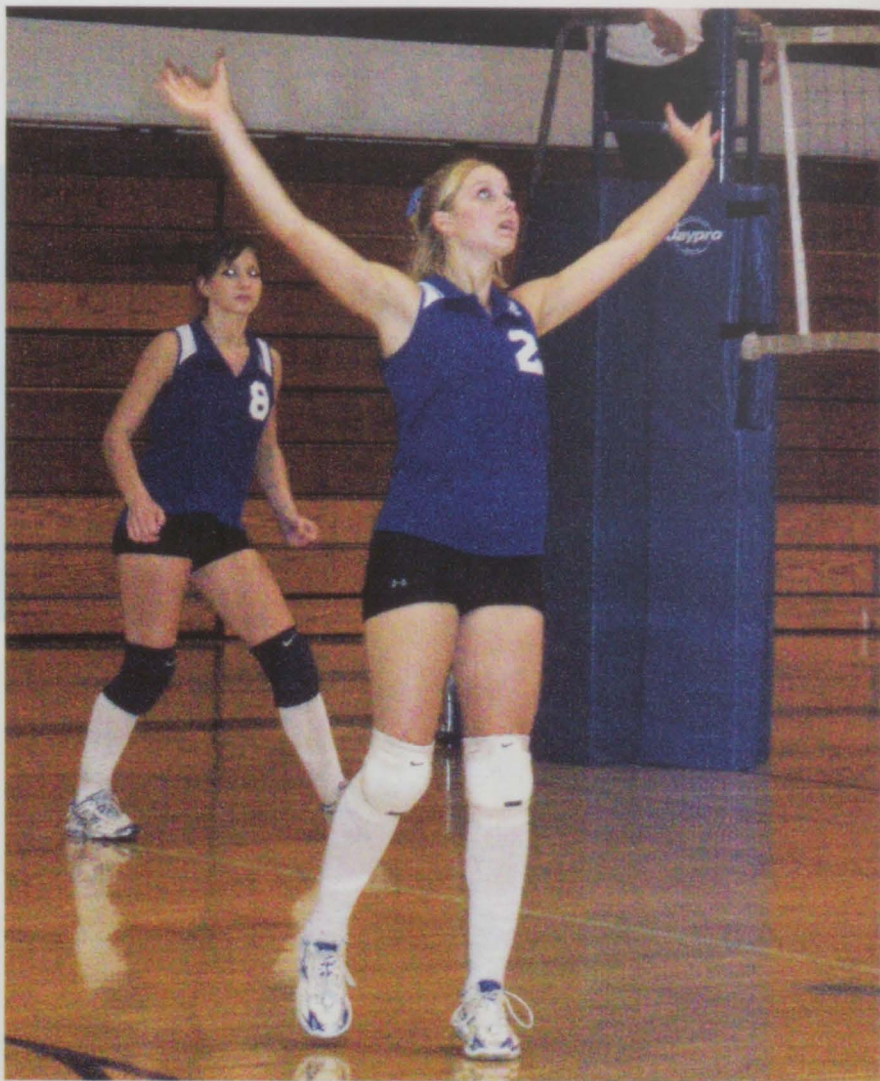

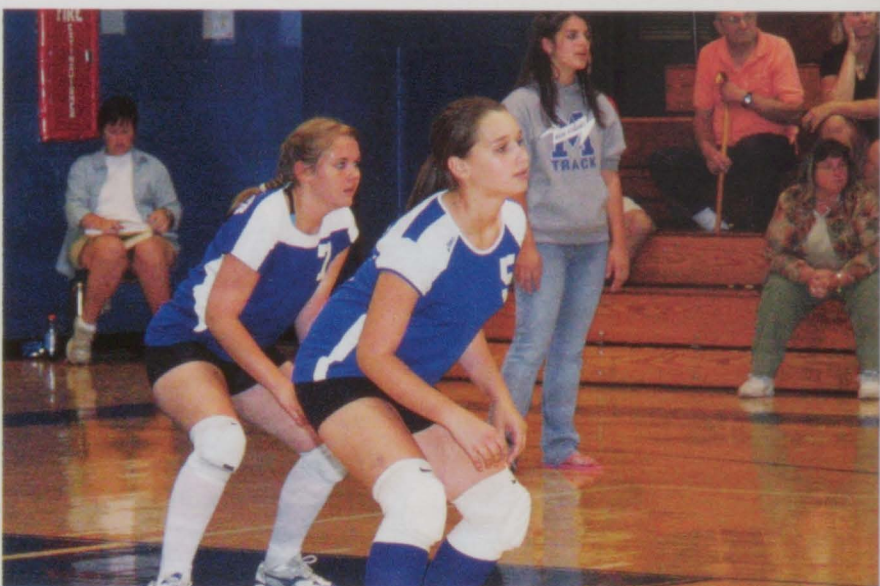

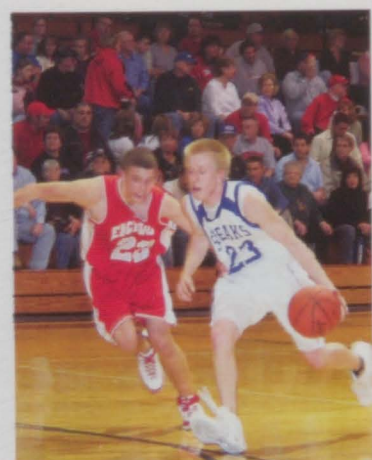

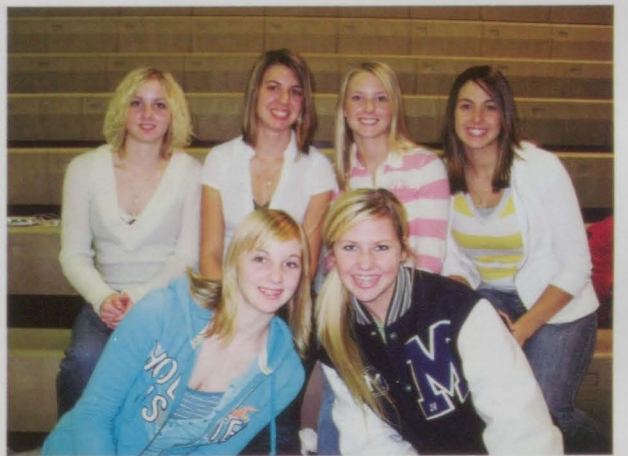

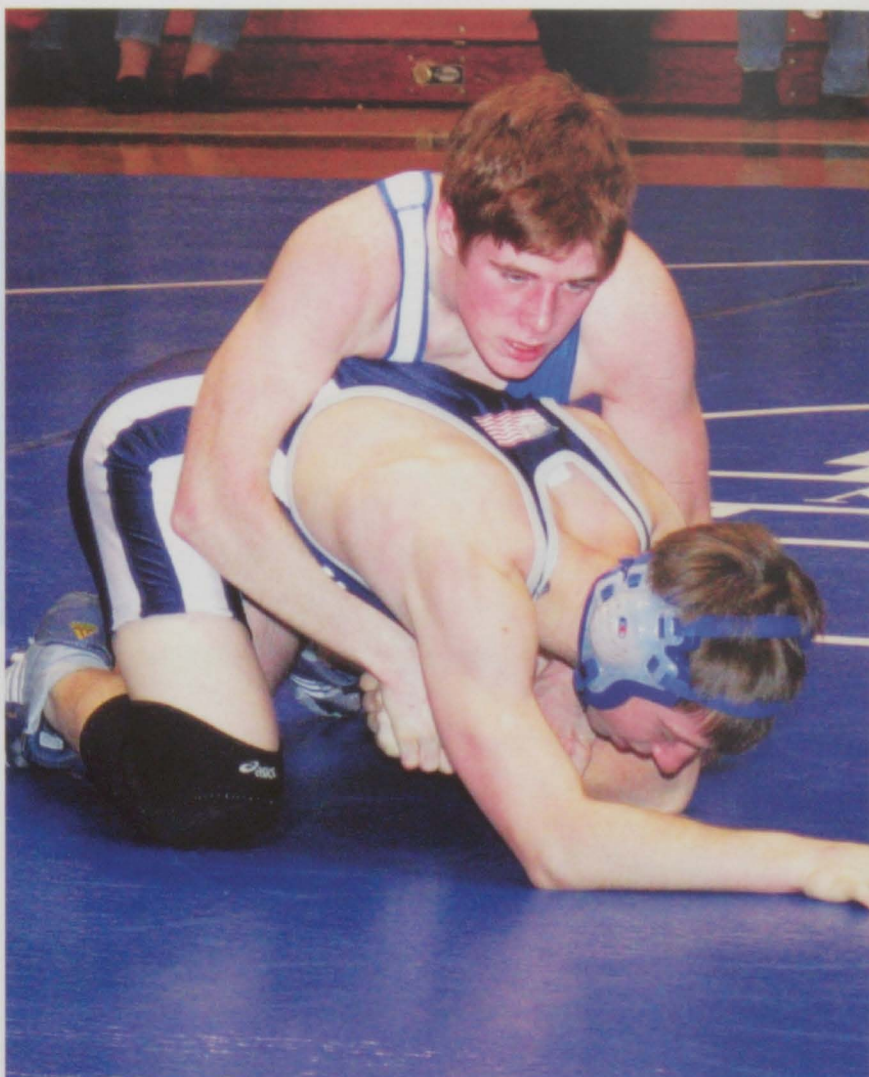

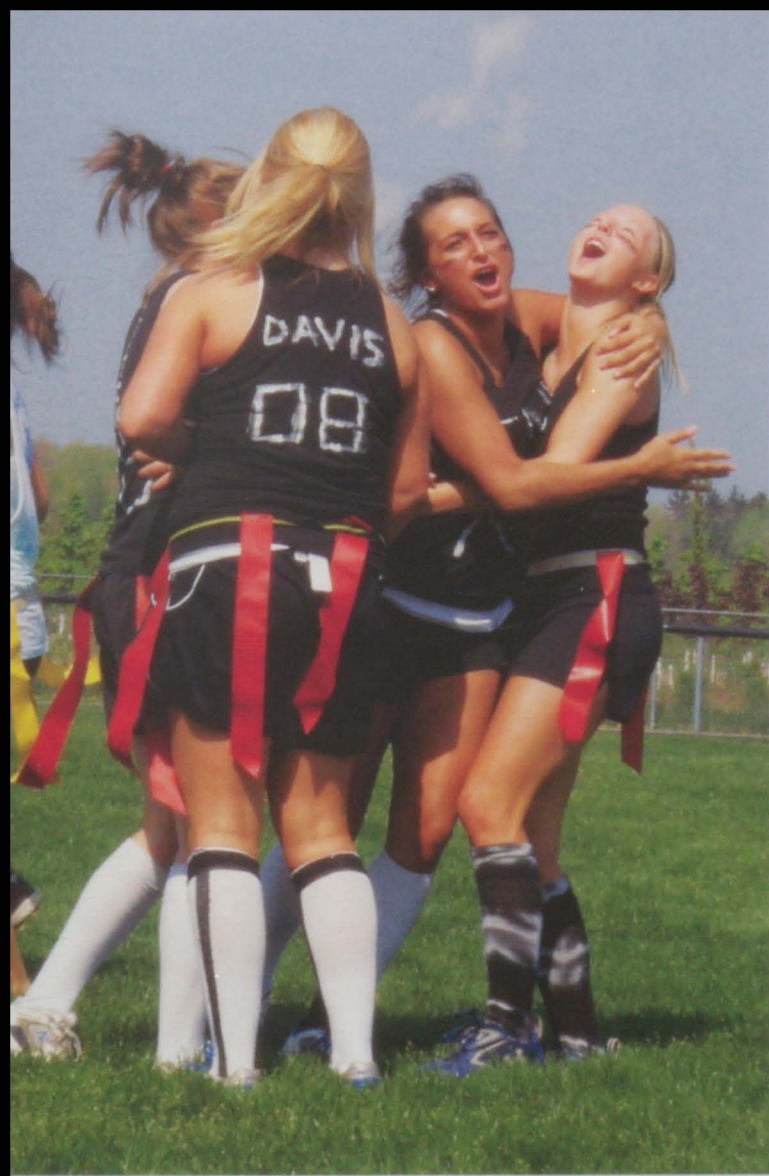

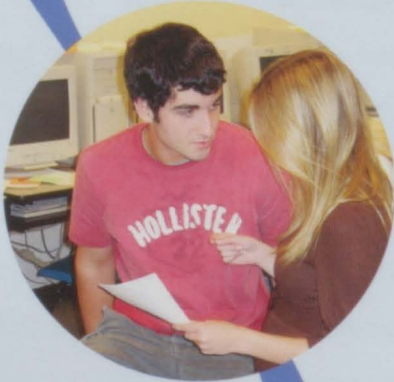

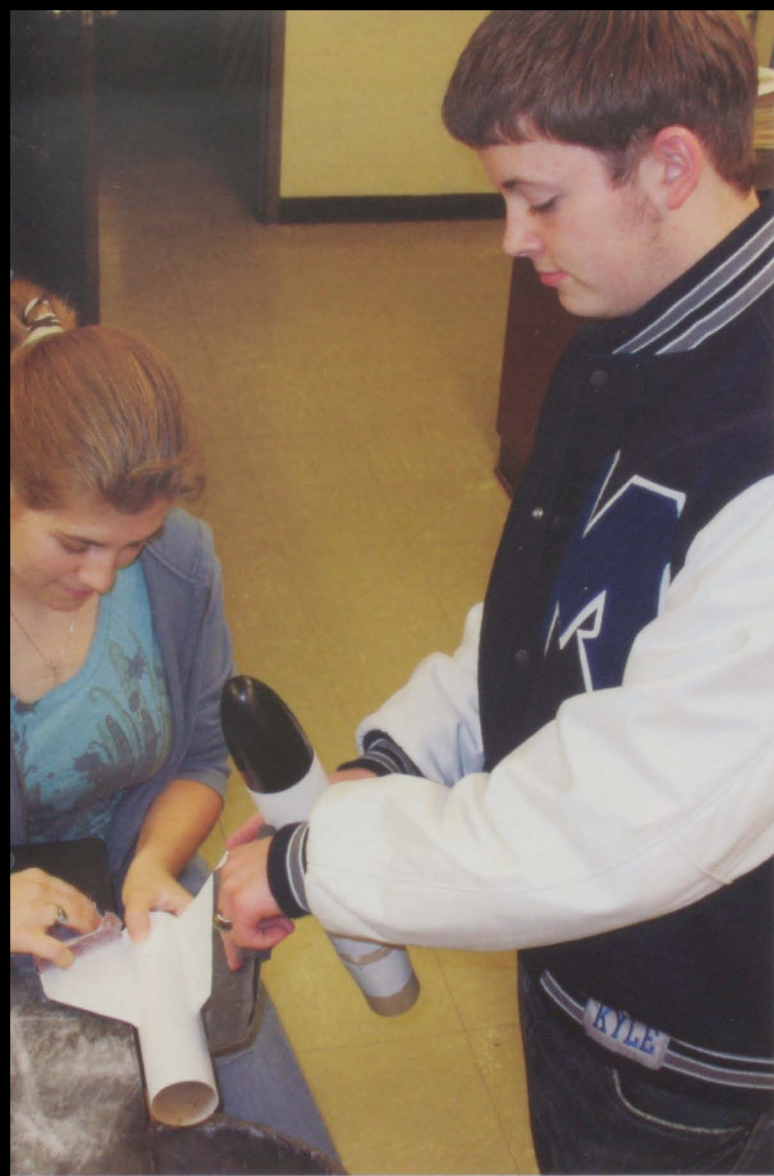

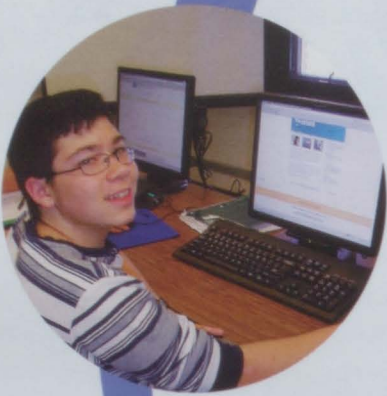

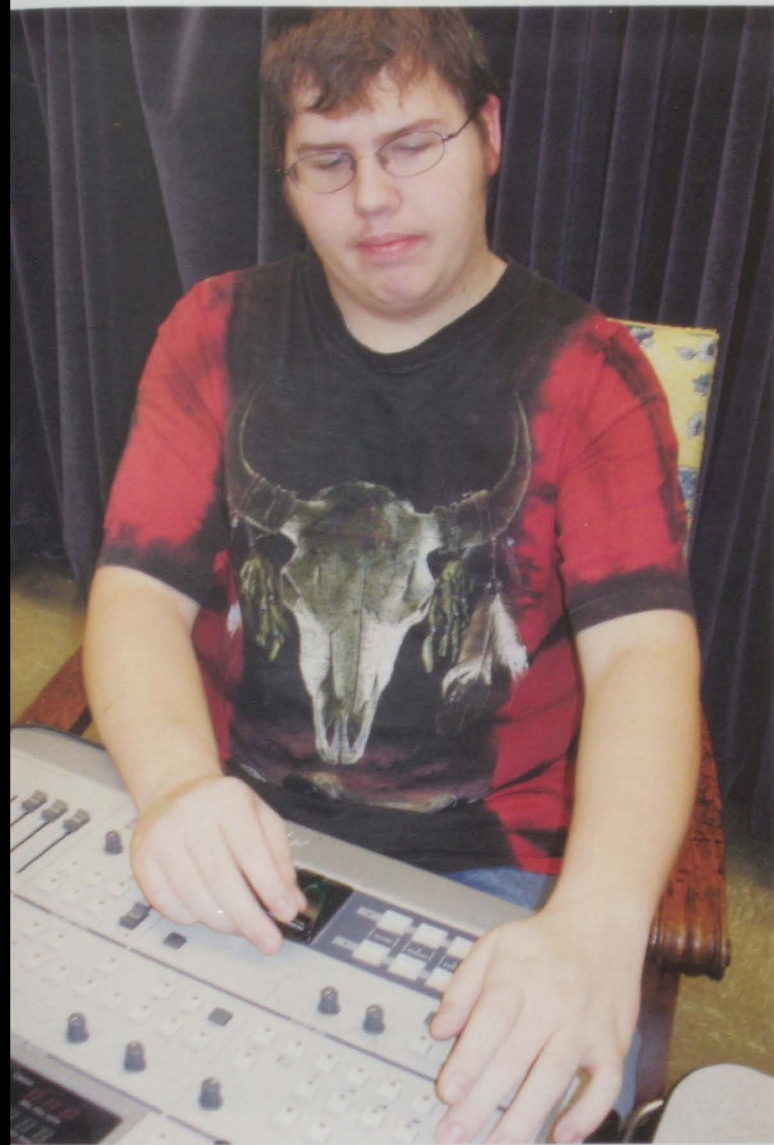

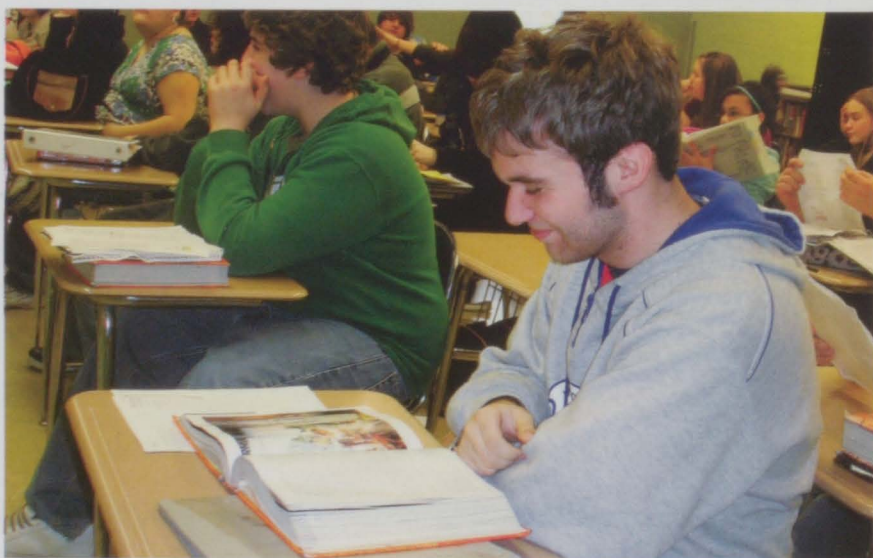

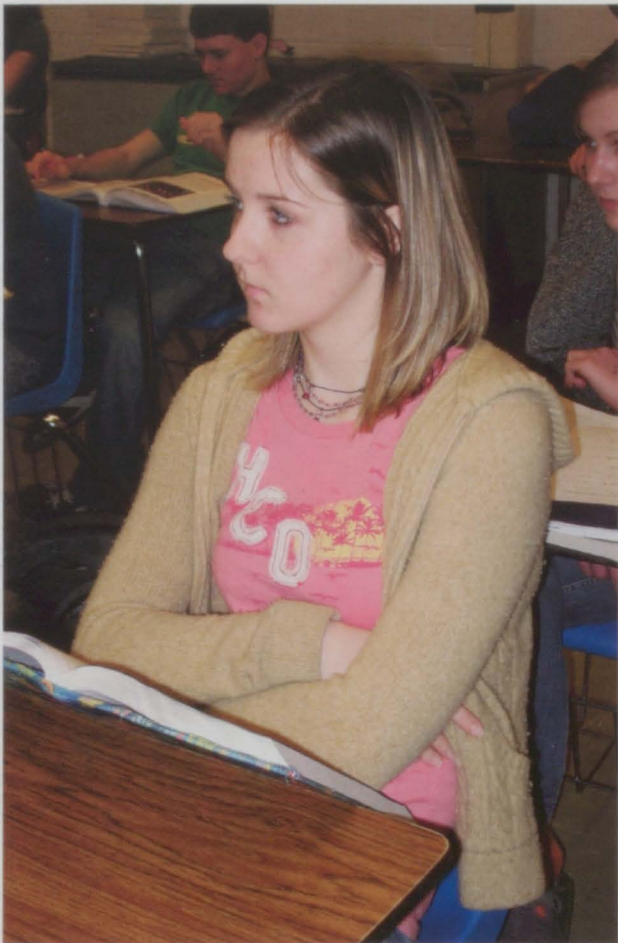

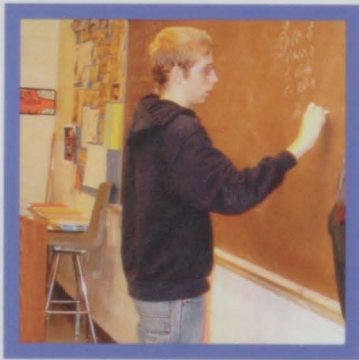


Discovering Life

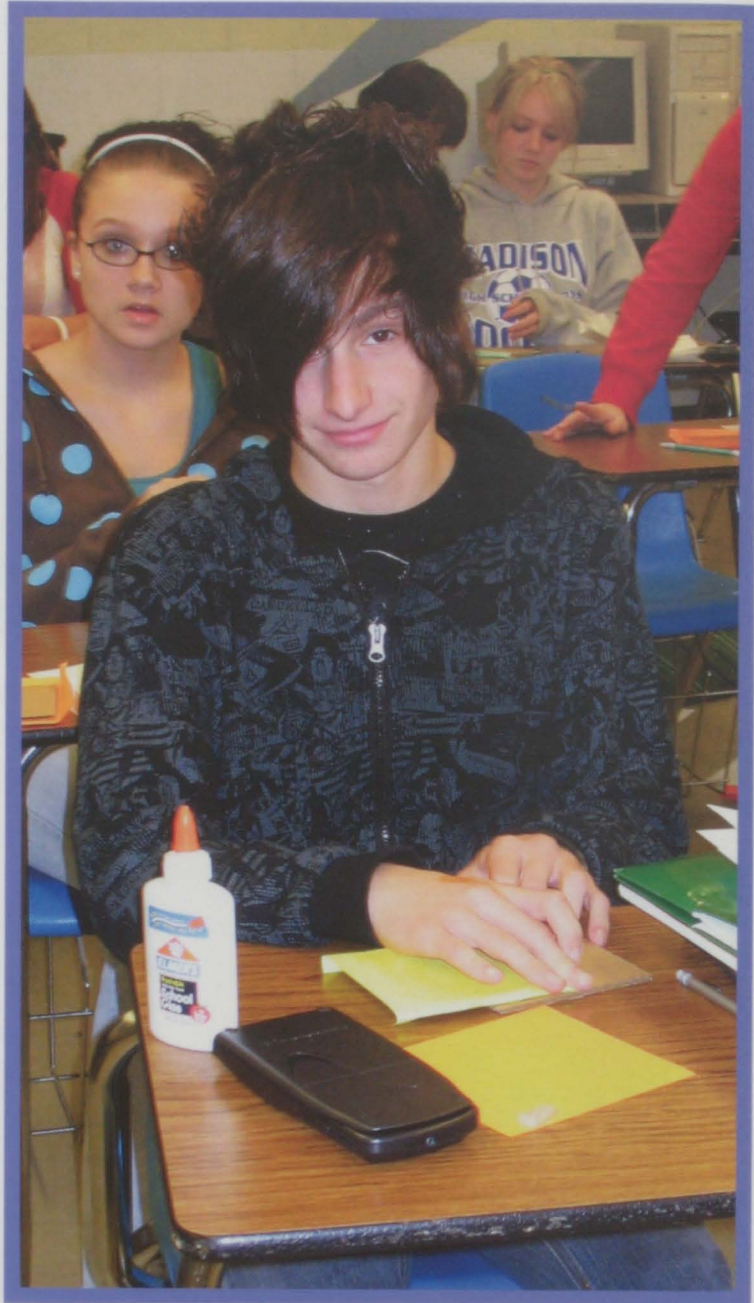

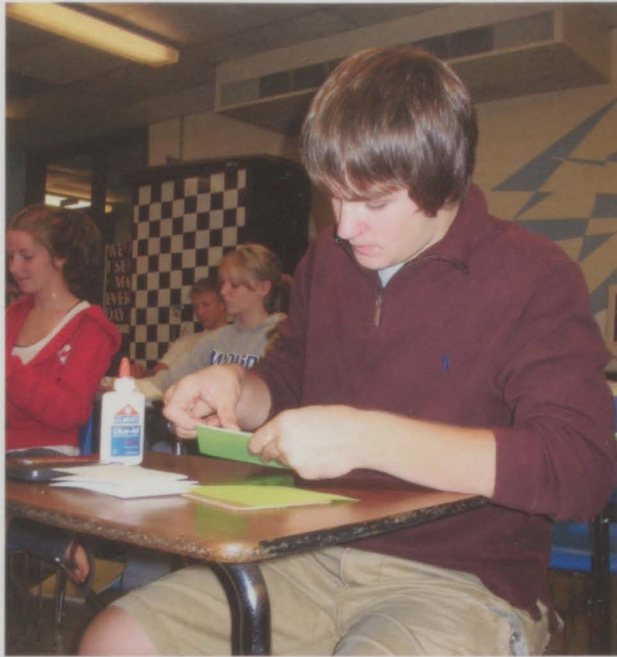

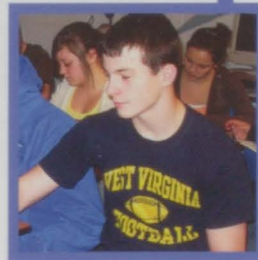

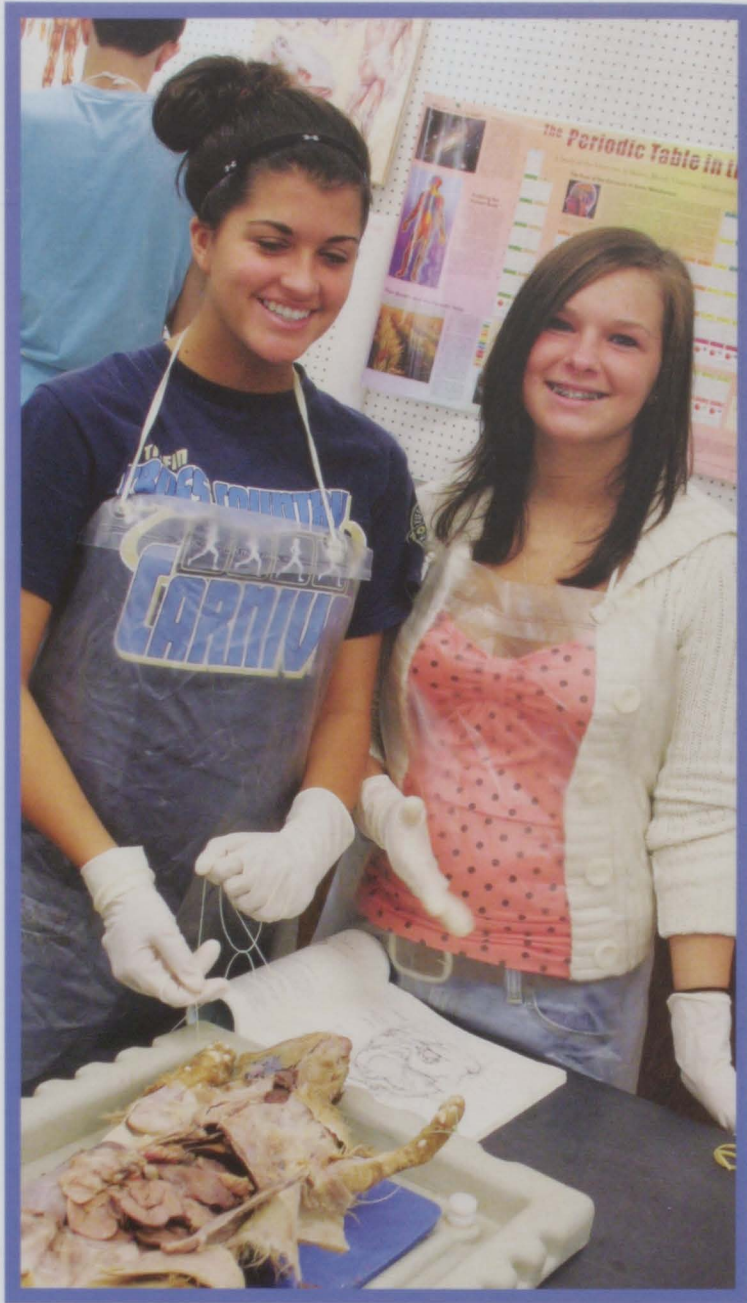

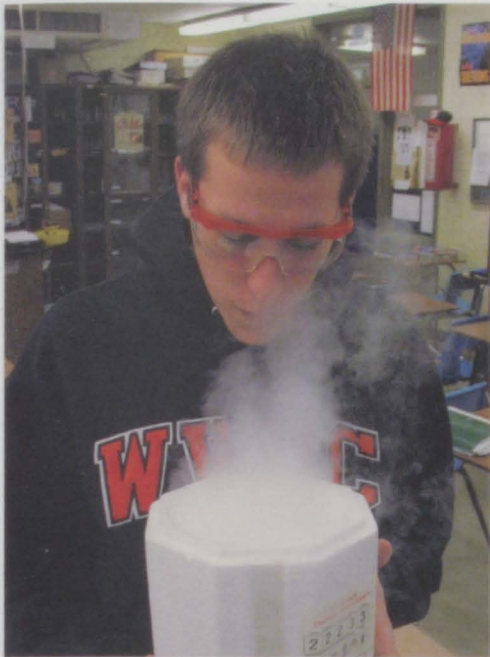

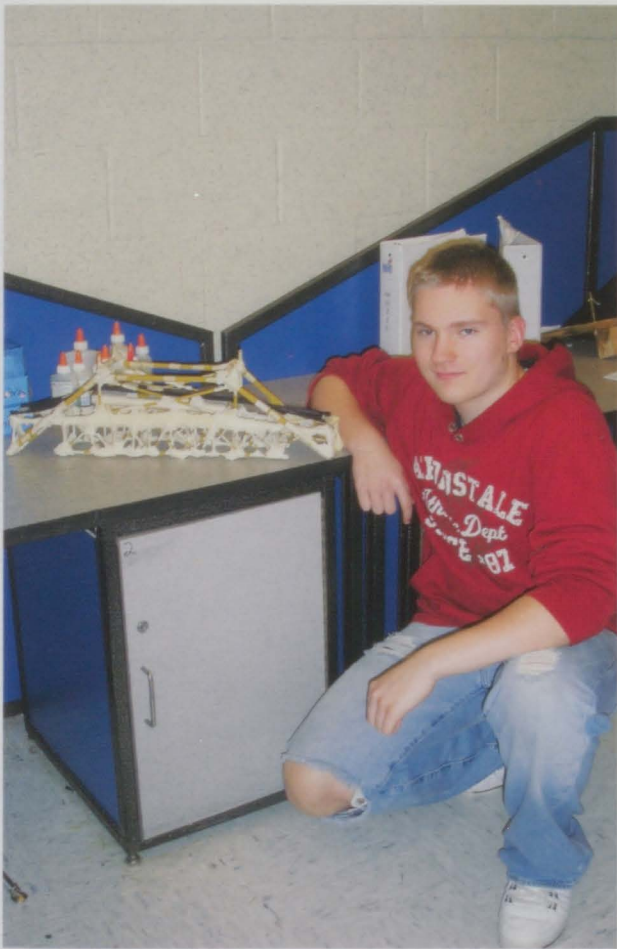

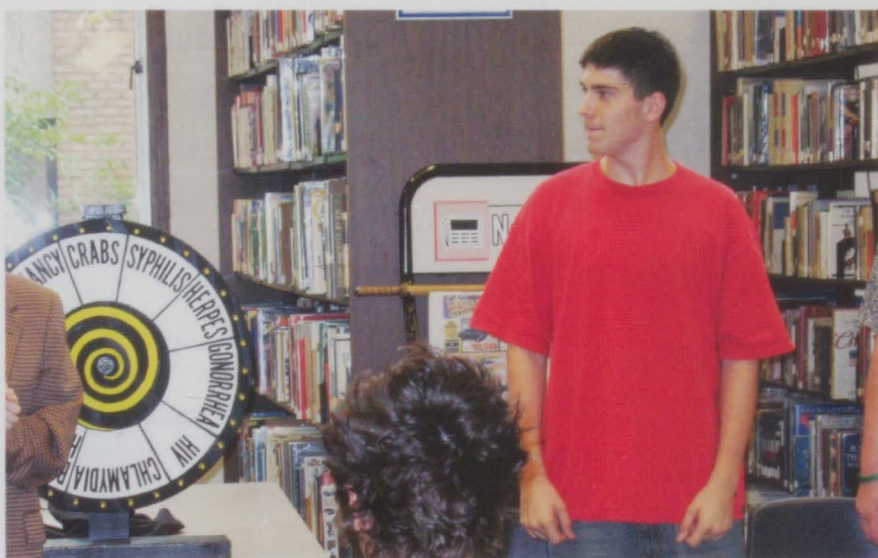

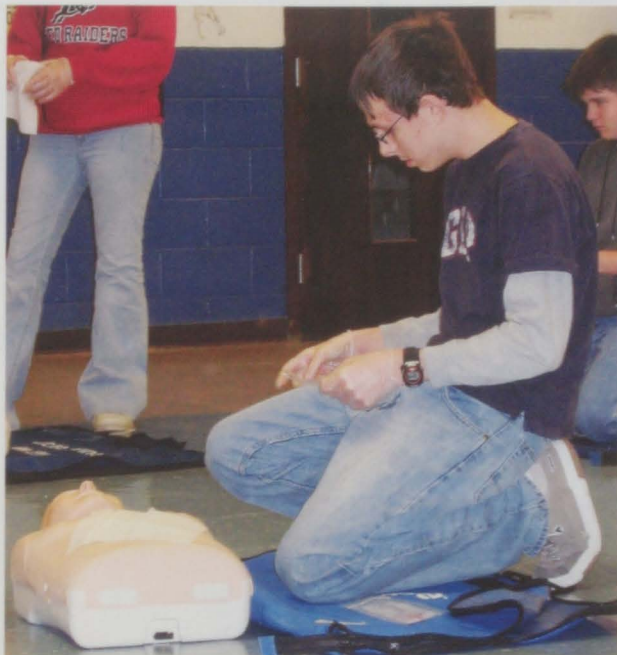

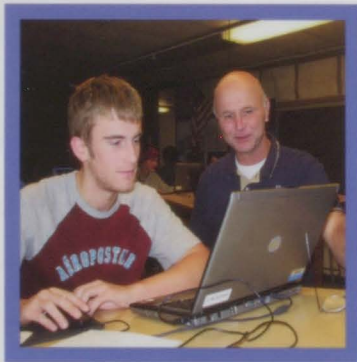


Experiencing Life Through Skills

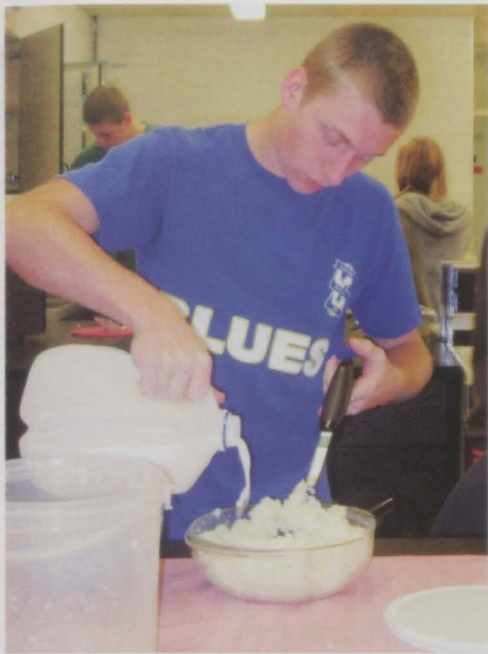

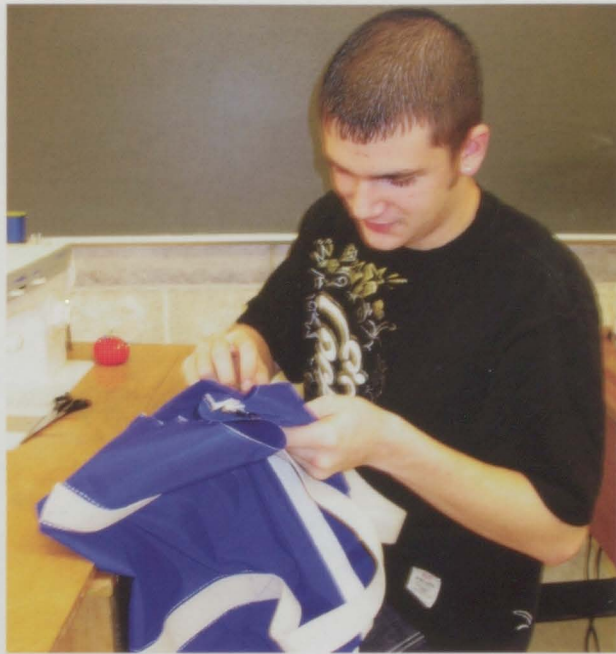

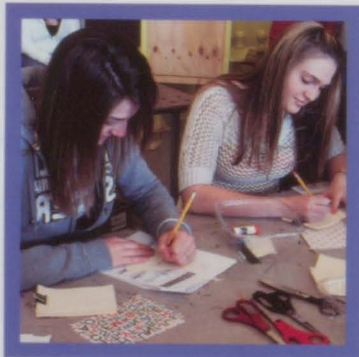


Living in a Different World

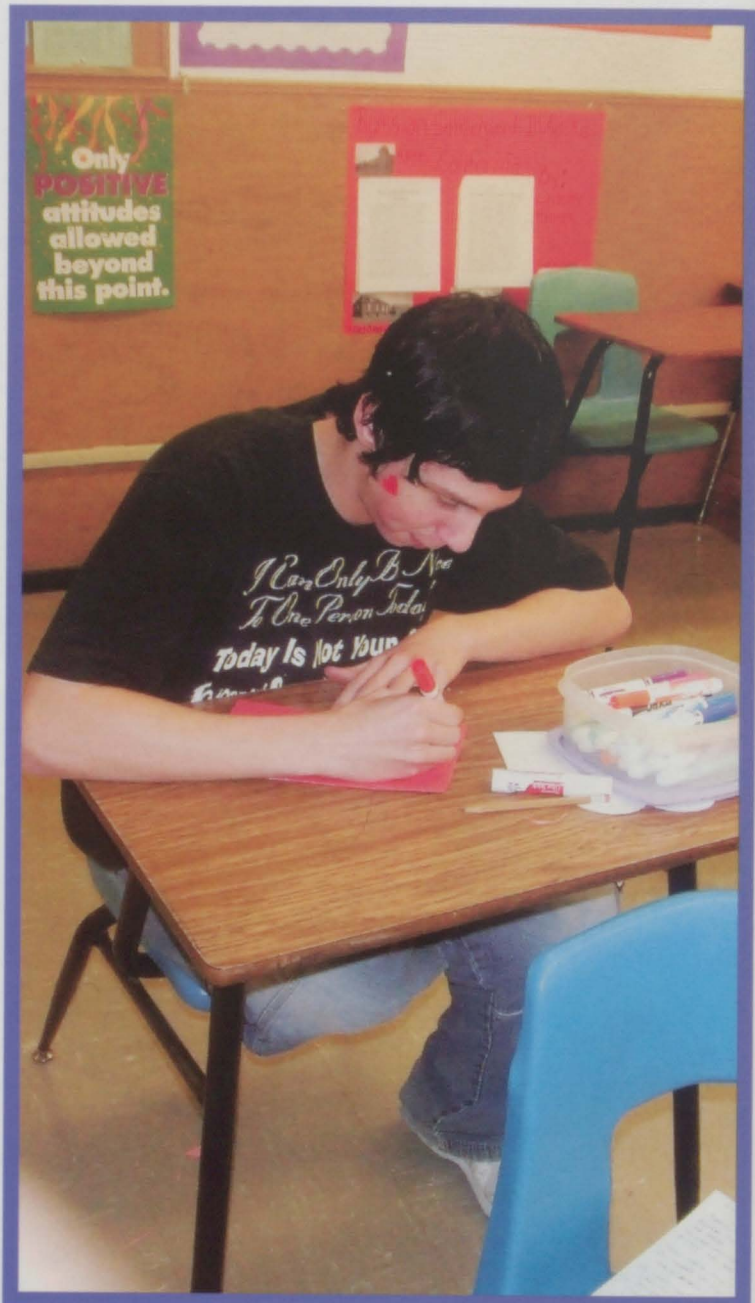

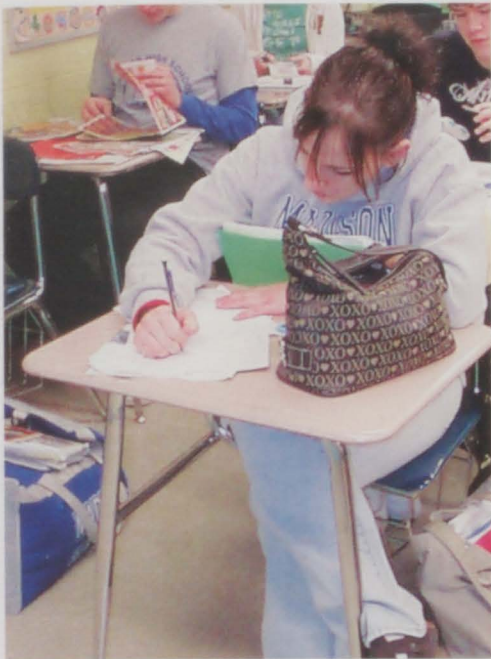

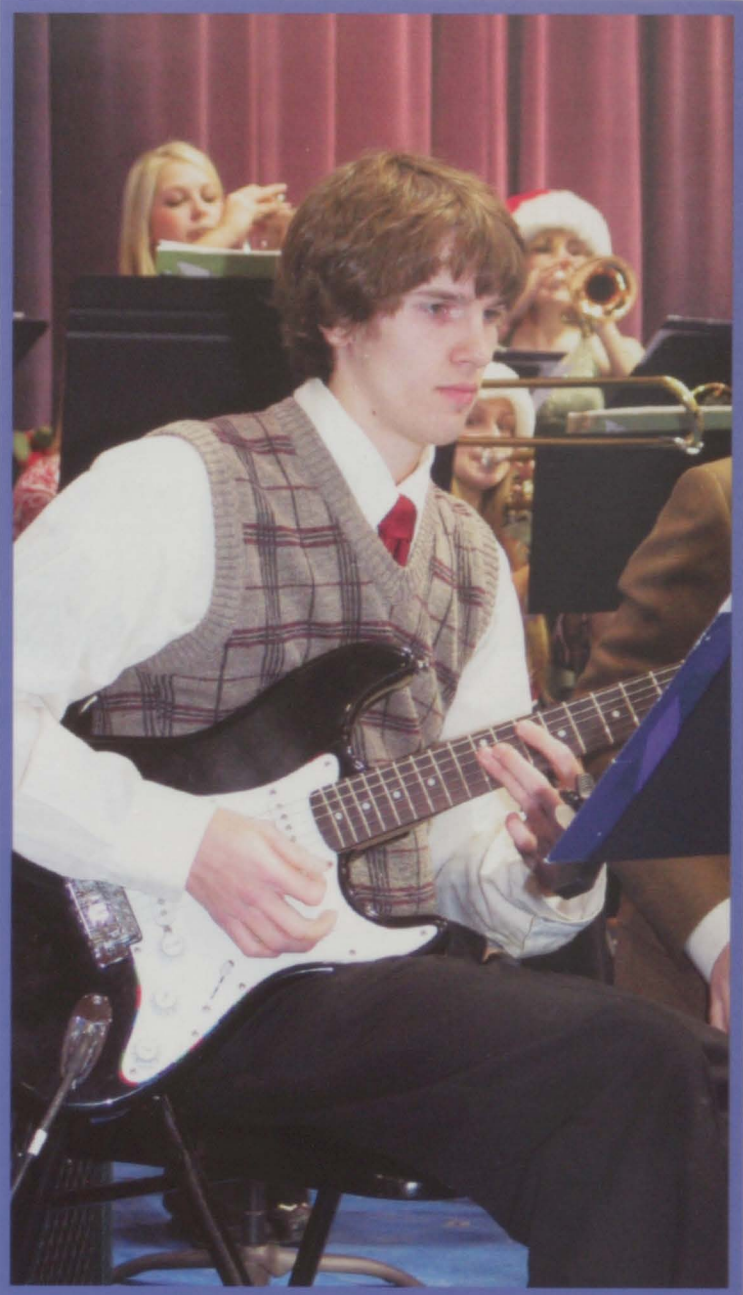


Hey Band!

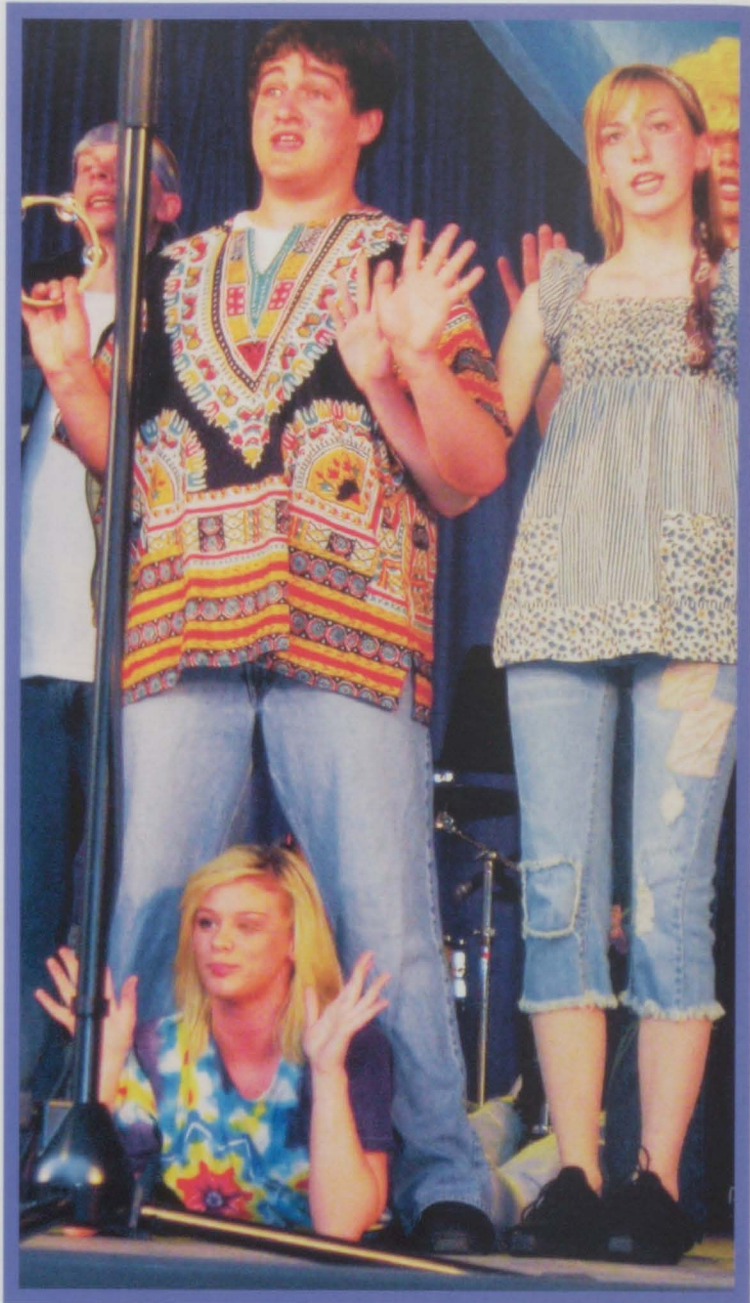


A Magical Journey

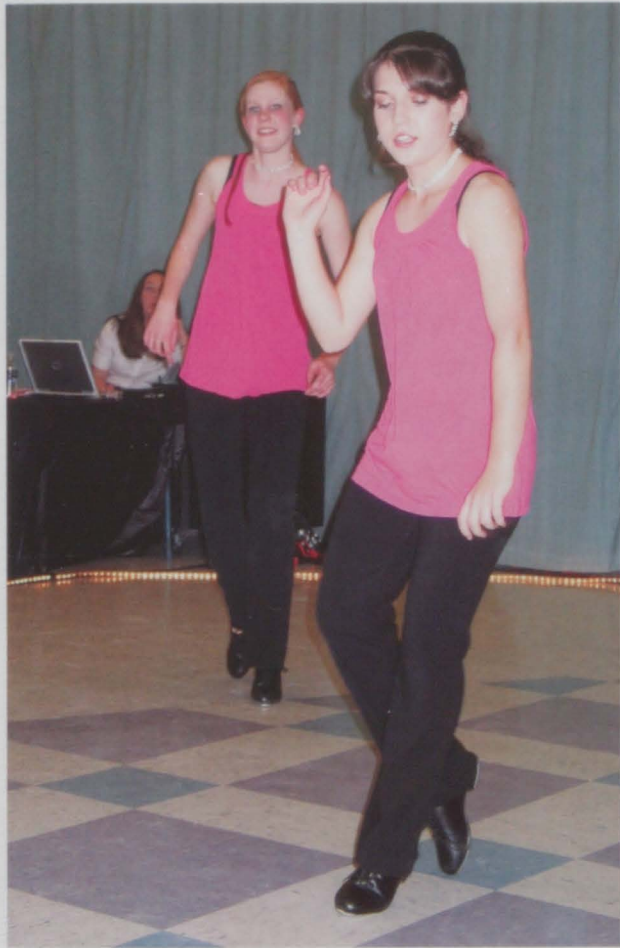

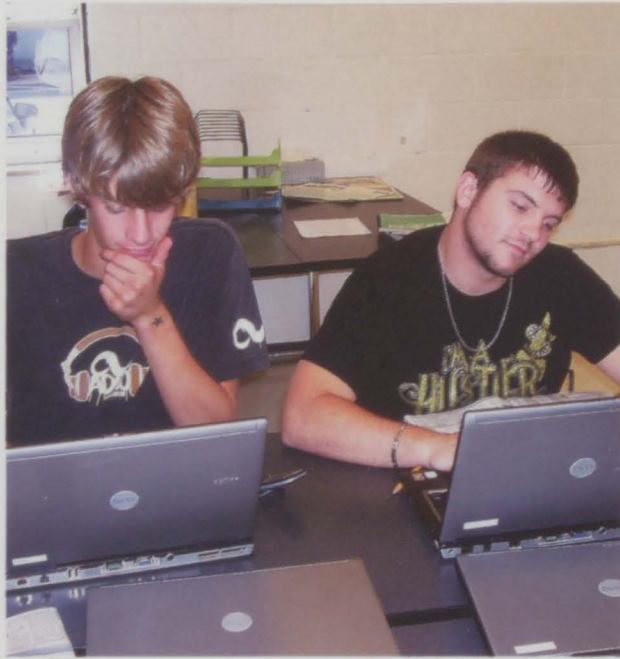

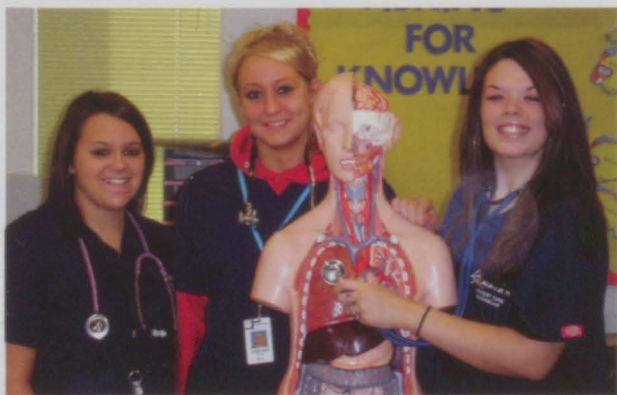

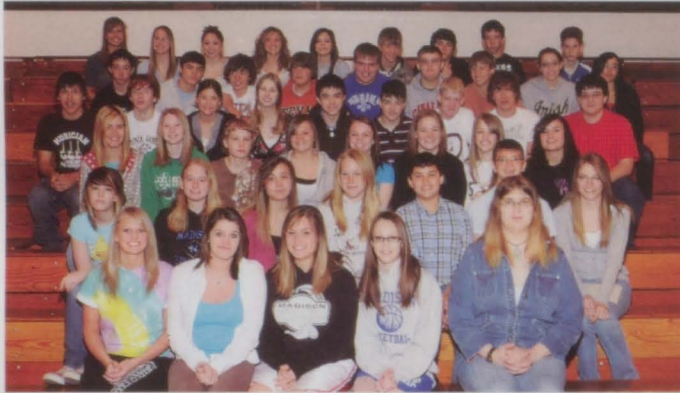
