


# Rewinding the Years





"The thing that I miss most about my hometown is my friends and family," quotes Luma Labanca. Luma comes all the way here from Brazil.




#### Vladimir Tretyakov
















## Makin' a Move










# You've Been Thunderstruck!





required to make the plays successful. While balancing sports, school work, and the production of a play, these talented students all deserve a round of applause.




