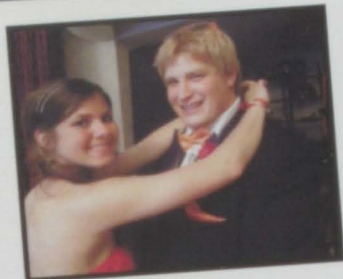

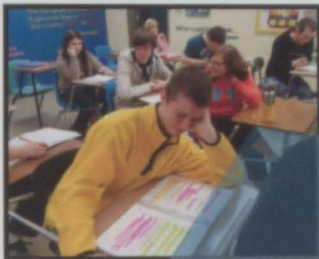

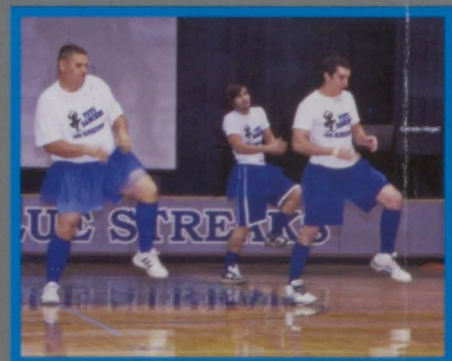

Into Proportion



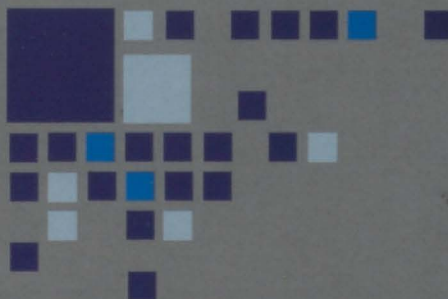

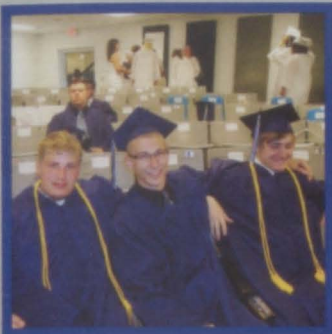


Good Bye High School... Hello Something New

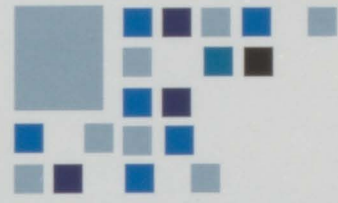
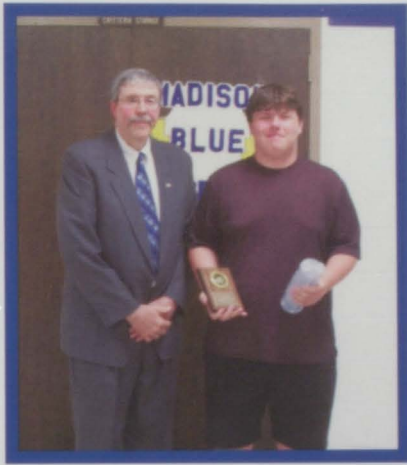


Achieving Success

Acting that is Out of this World

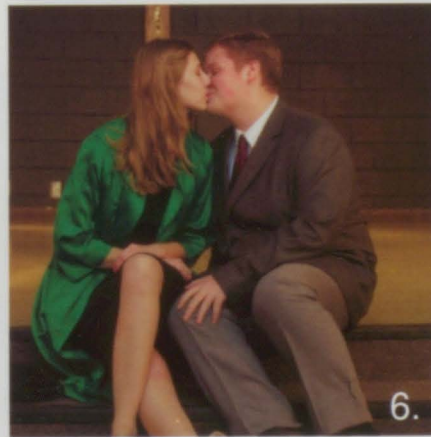

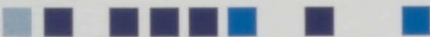

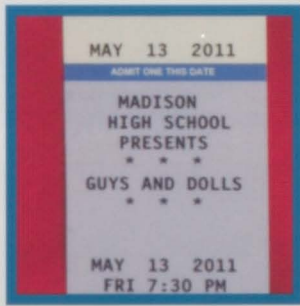
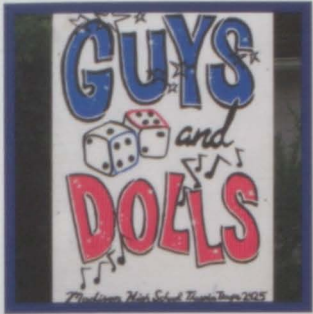


Guy's and Dolls

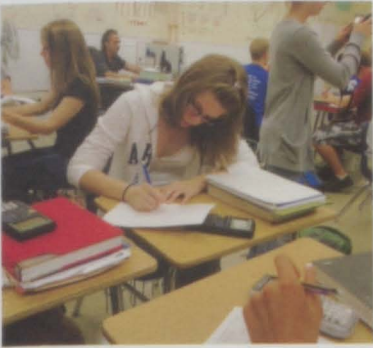

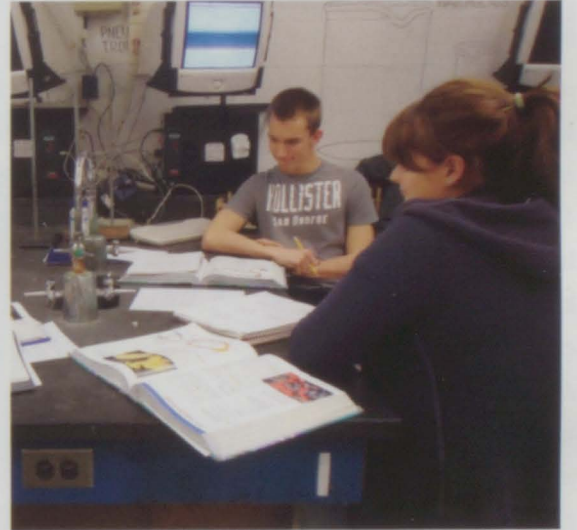
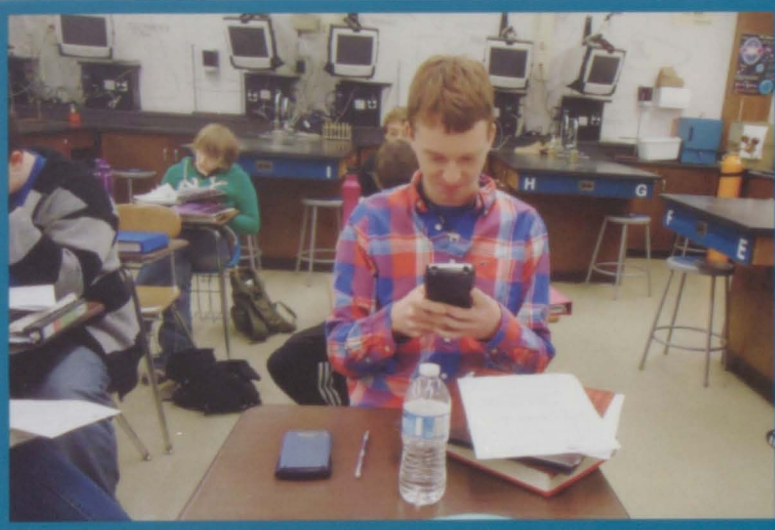
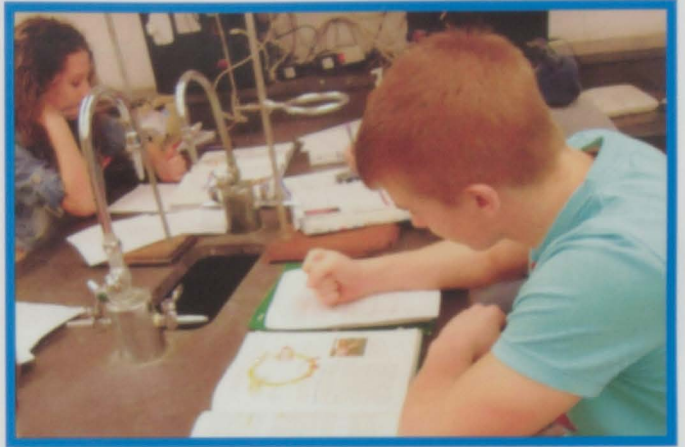


Experimental Fun

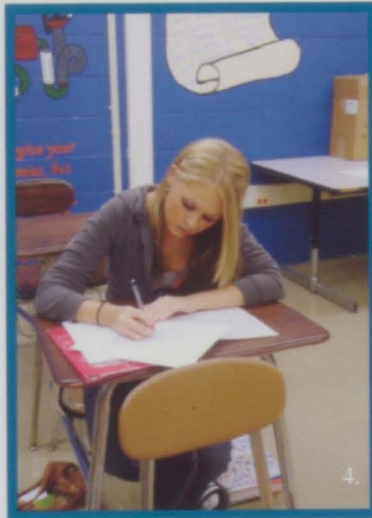
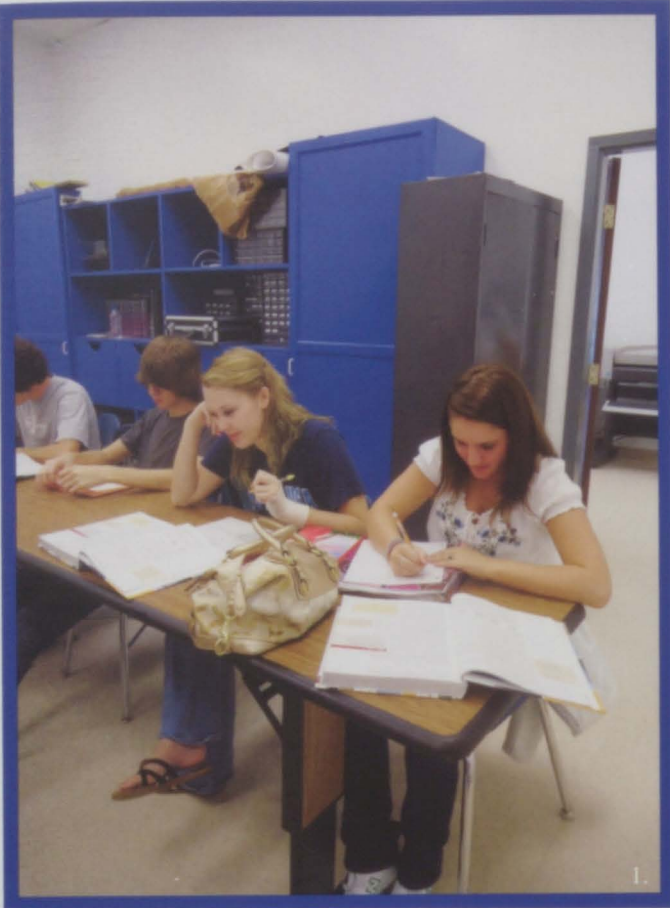
Every social

This year's foreign language department at MHS had two widely known languages, Spanish and Russian. With classes being available all the way up to the fourth year the students here were able to learn about different cultures.

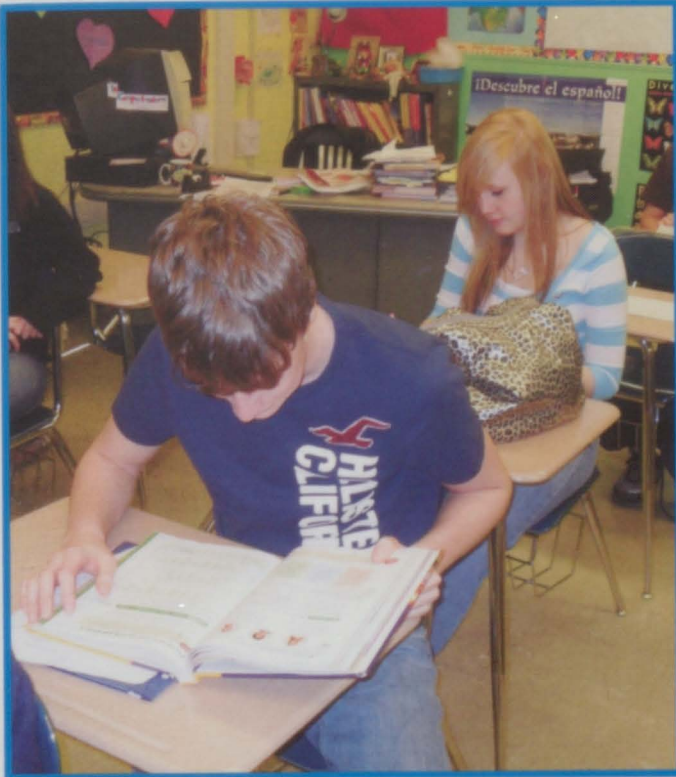

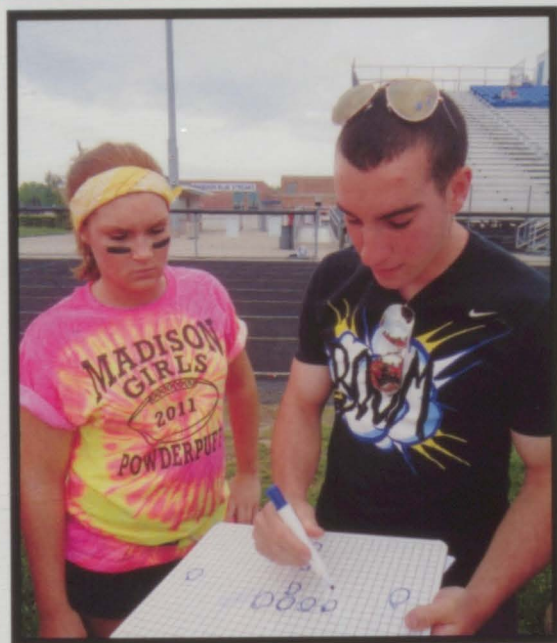

The MHS choir department can proudly say that they have a new addition to their team, the Choir Booster Organization. This team of parents assist Miss Groah in the fundraising

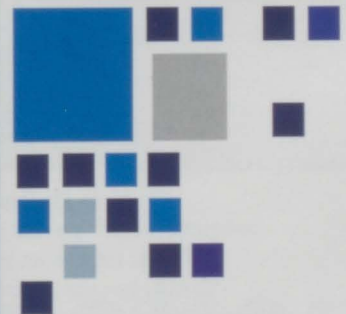

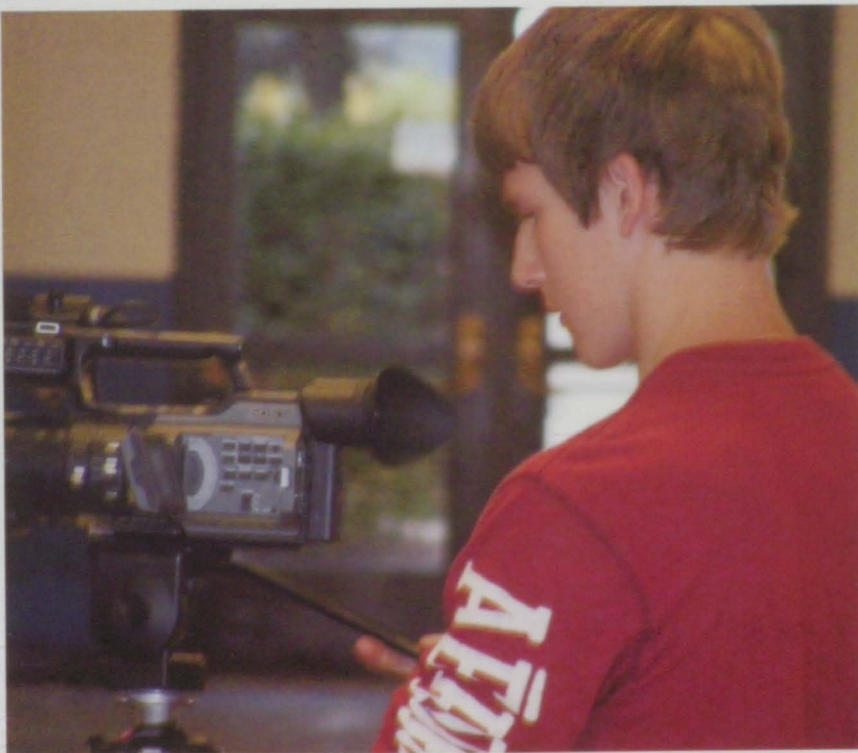

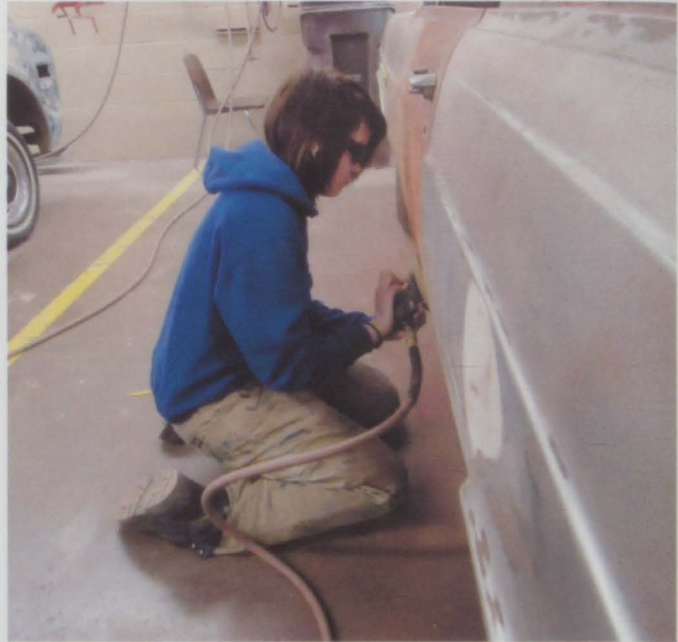

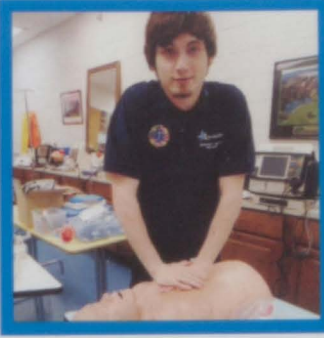


Working for the Future

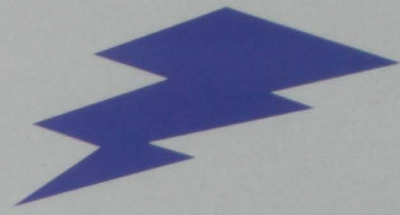

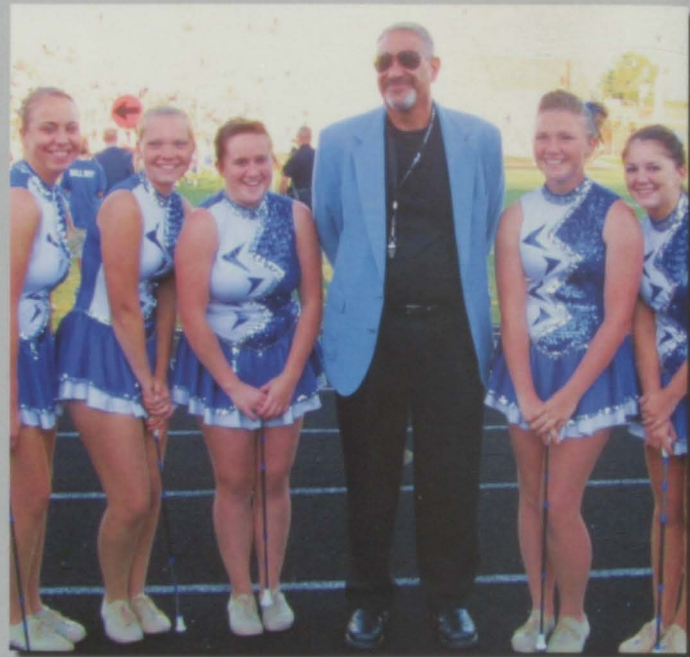

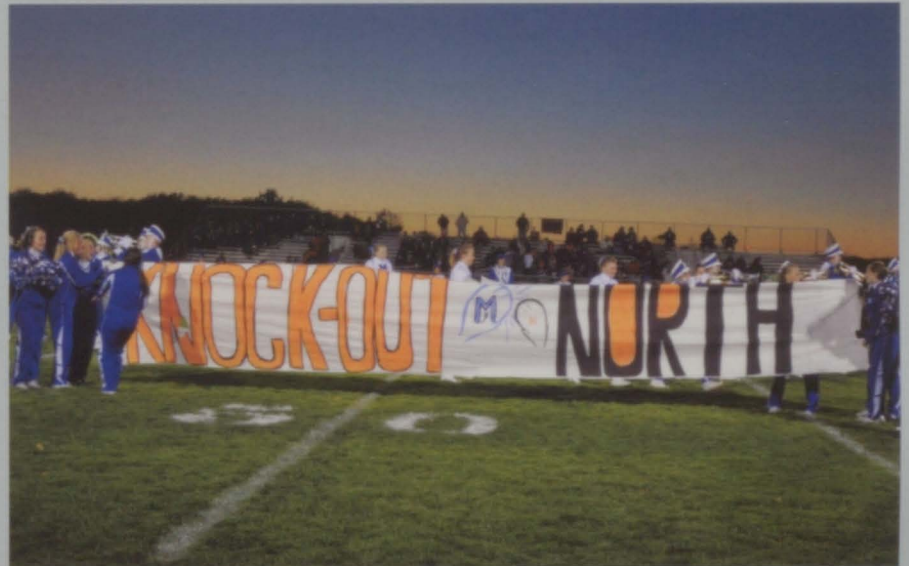

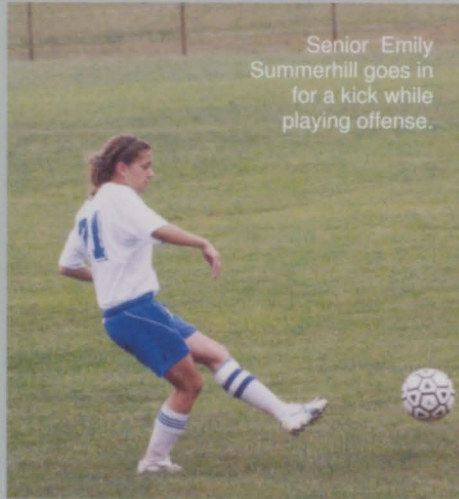

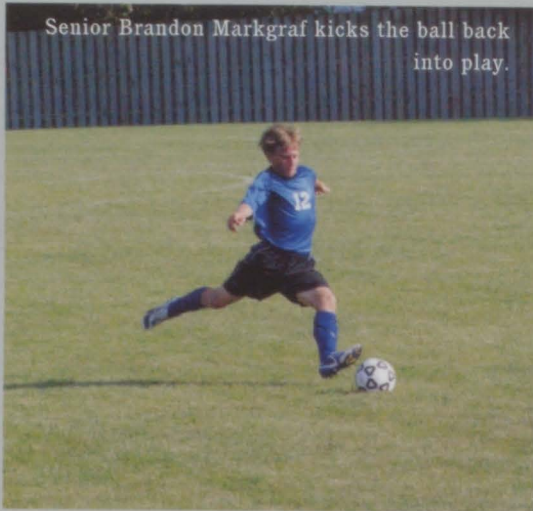

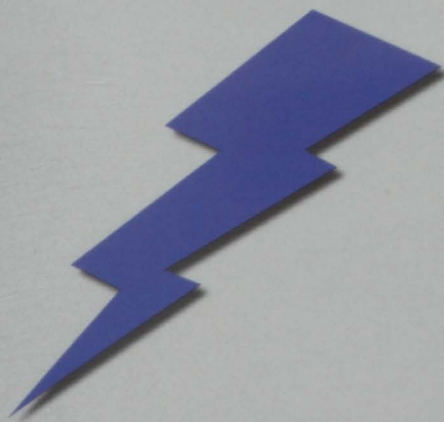

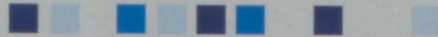

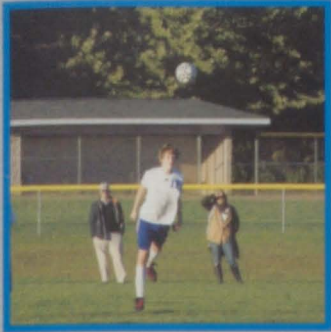
KICKING IT TO THE TOP

The boys JV team also had a great season as well. They practiced hard and played even harder. They are looking forward to next season.

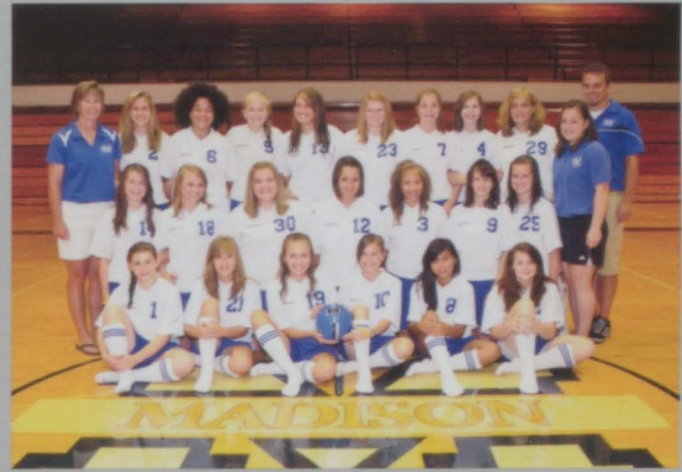

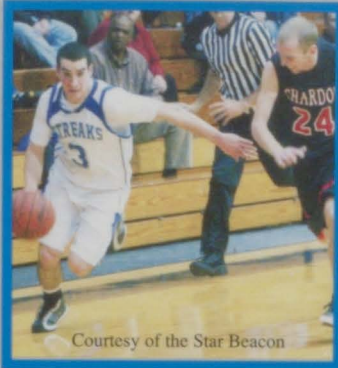

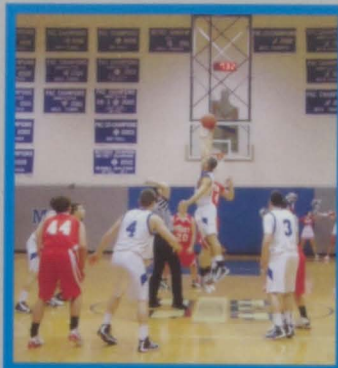

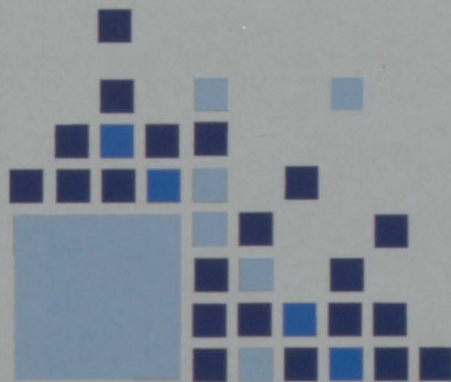

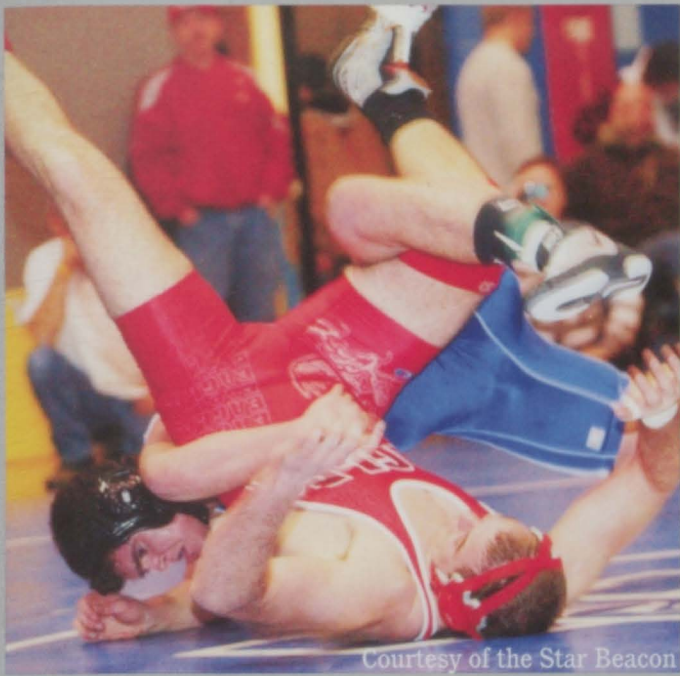

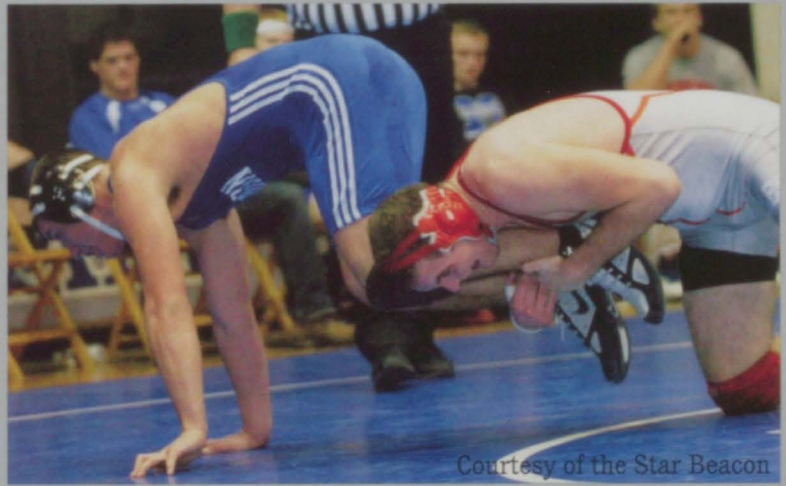

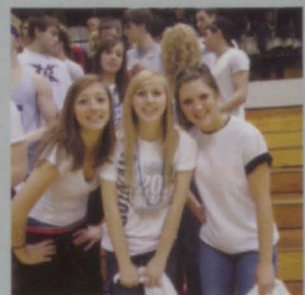

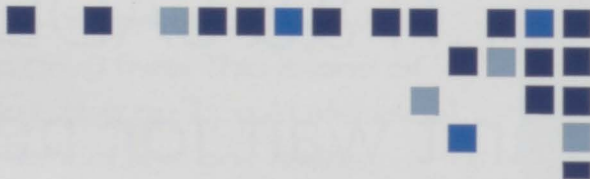
A Helping Hand

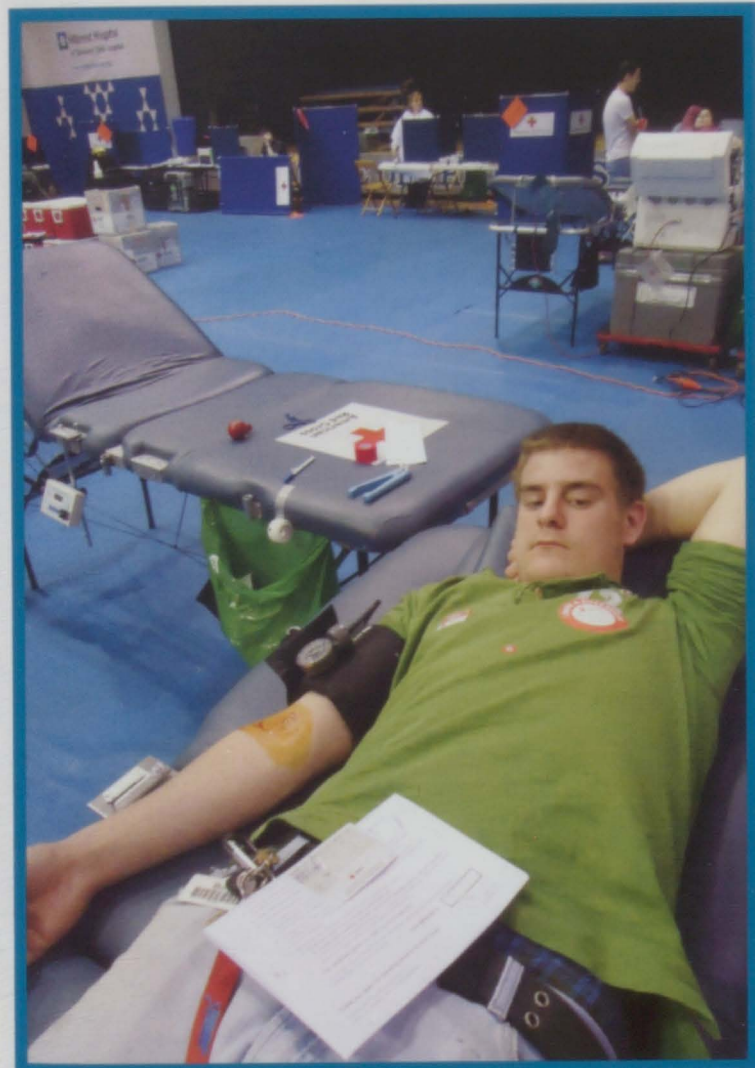

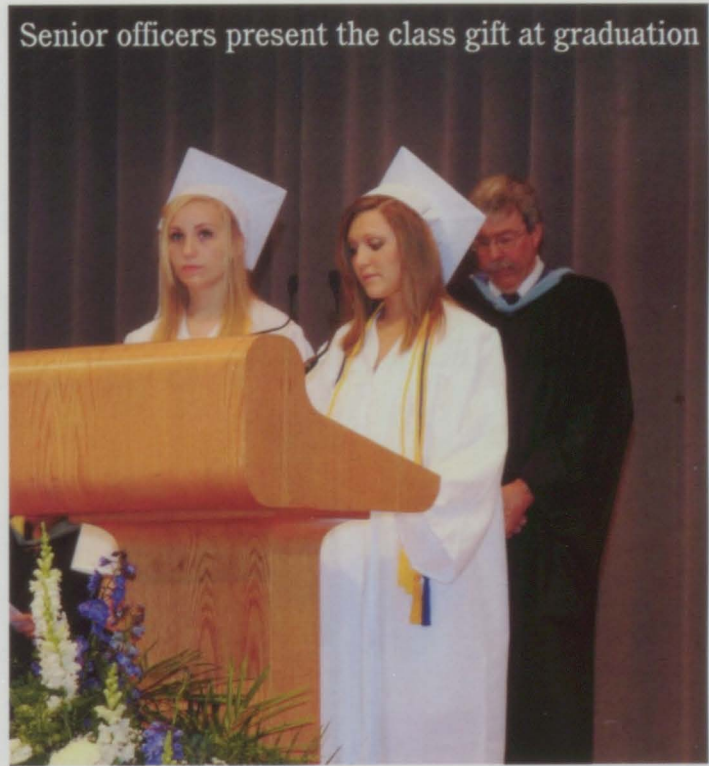

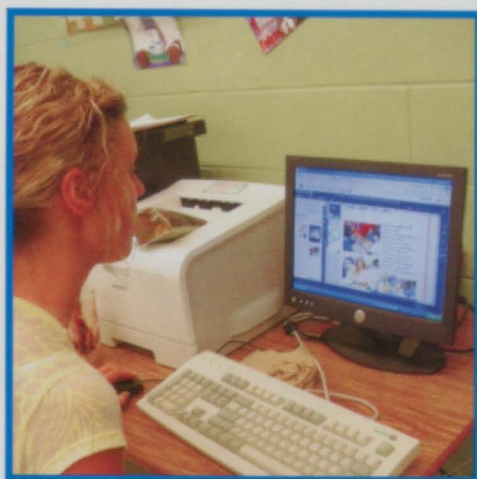
