

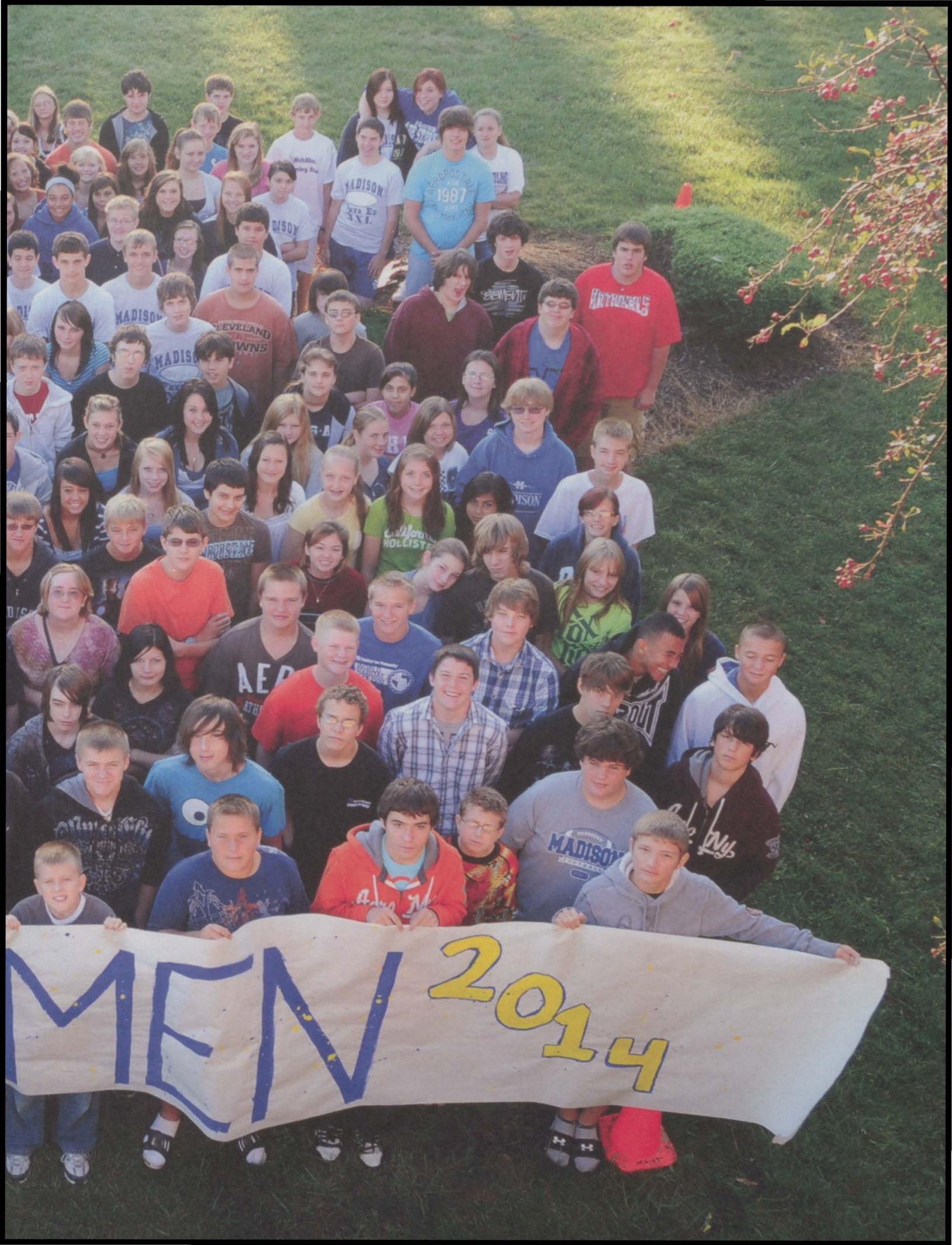

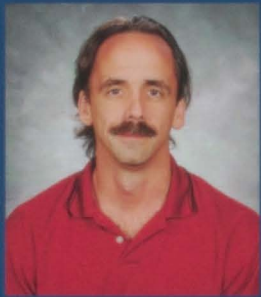

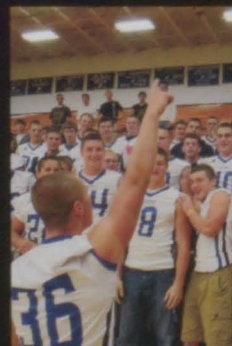
Homecoming

2014 continued the era of dominance as the senior captains led the football team in retaining the fabled little brown jug from rivals Perry. This success would bolster the team well into the postseason.

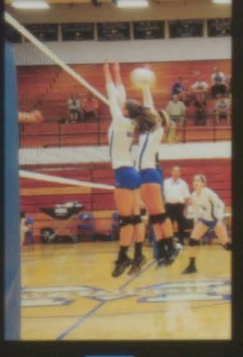

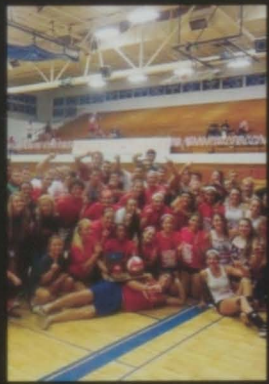


Girl Power

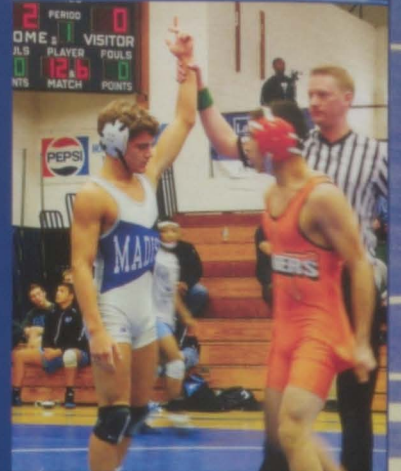
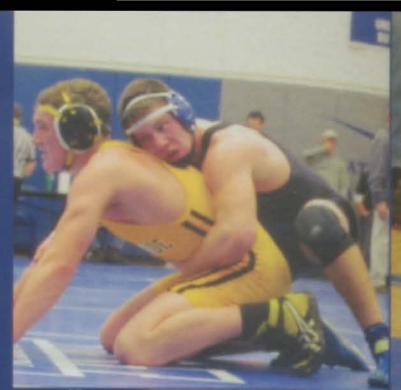
WRESTLING

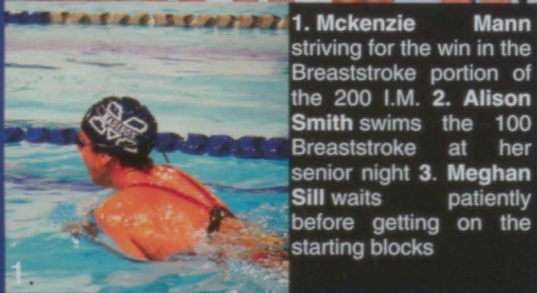
GIRLS SWIMMING
